Dr. John McLoughlin, having been called on the part of the said Defendants testified that in the year eighteen hundred and forty or eighteen hundred and forty one he warned the said Whitman of his danger in residing among the Cayuse people that he invited him to come and spend the winter with him at Vancouver and that in the spring he the said Whitman could go to the Willamette that if he the said Whitman would absent himself from the said people for two years they would feel his loss and invite him to return which he could do in safety He warned him against giving medicine to Indians as they Indians killed their medicine men.

Dr John McLoughlin, having been called
on the part of the said Defendants testifying
that in ^{the year} eighteen hundred ^{and forty} or eighteen hundred
and forty one he warned the said Whitman of
his danger in residing among the Cayuse people:-
that he invited him to come and spend ^(the)
winter with him at Vancouver and that in the
spring he the said Whitman could go to the
Willamette, that if he the said Whitman would
absent himself from the said people for two
years they would feel his loss and invite
him to return which he could do in safety
He warned him against giving medicine to
Indians as they ^{Indians} killed their medicine men.
