Whereas, lately in the Supreme Court of the State of Oregon before you, or some of you, in a case between Ellsworth Kelly and James Willos, appellants, and the State of Oregon, appellee, wherein the judgment of the said Supreme Court, entered in said cause on the 22nd day of June, A. D. 1926, was in favor of the said appellee, the State of Oregon, and against the said appellants;

And whereas, in the present term of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six the said cause came on to be heard before the Supreme Court of the United States on the said transcript of record, and was signed by counsel:

On consideration whereof, it is now here ordered and adjudged by this court that the writ of error in this cause be, and the same is hereby, dismissed for the want of jurisdiction.
