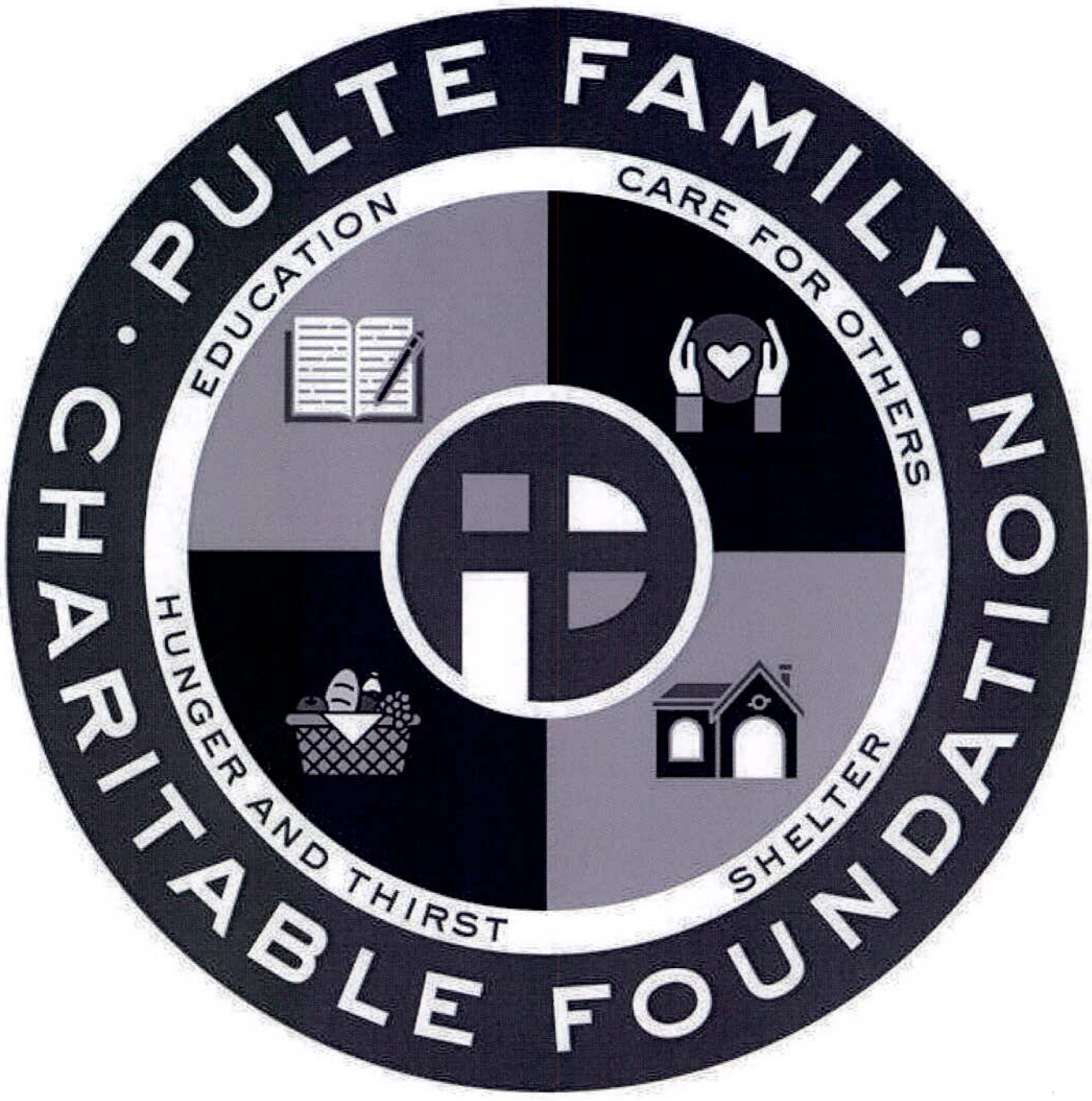

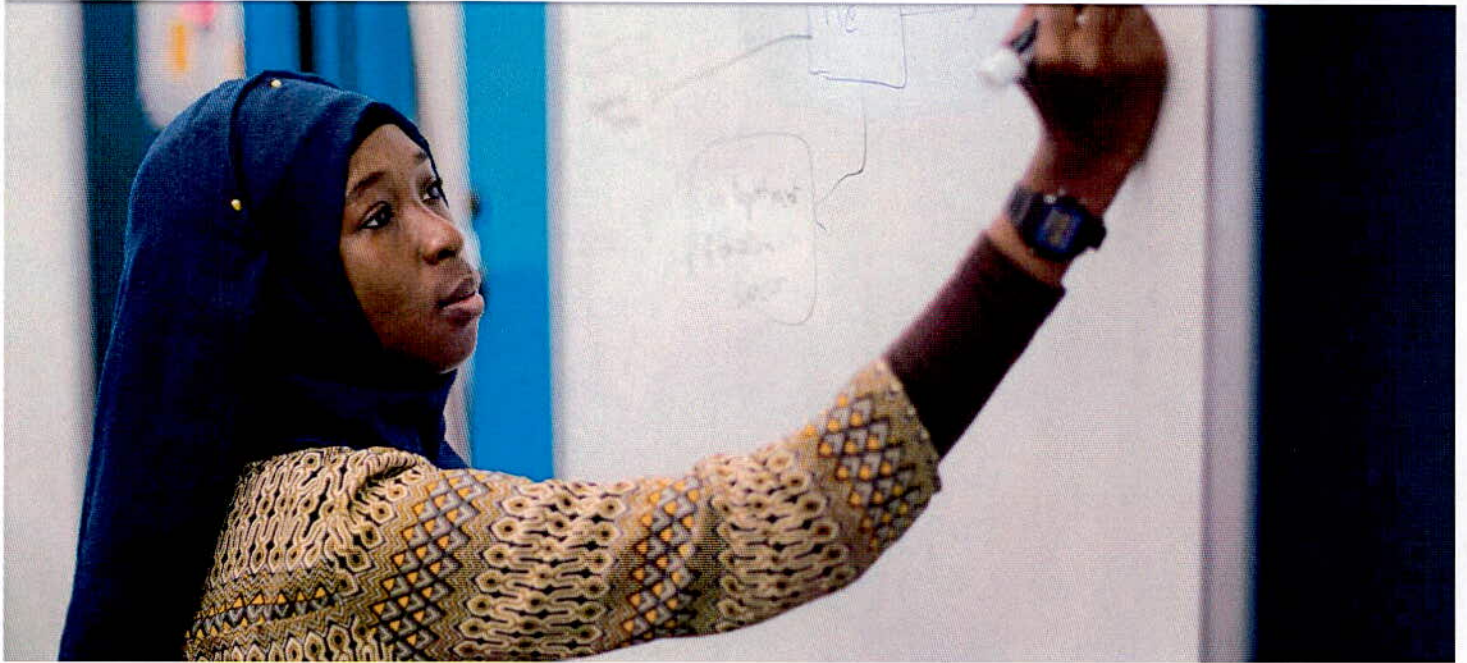
**Section 5:**
