The matter of need for an increased budget and field staff if the Board of Eugenics increases its service to the courts and agencies other than the State institutions was discussed. The proposed budget for the 1951-53 biennium as drawn up by Dr. McNutt was reviewed. This budget, which would include psychiatrists' services on a fee basis, social investigators, part-time stenographer, travel expenses, and supplies including pre-marital forms, totals \$10,620.00 After some discussion of this budget, it was suggested that the matter be referred back to Dr. McNutt and that any action taken by the Board should take place in Salem so that the other members of the Board of Eugenics could be present. This suggestion was approved in a motion made by Dr. Burkes, seconded by Dr. Griffith and carried.

The Secretary reviewed the procedure which has been followed in handling sex deviation cases referred by the courts in the interim between Board meetings. A discussion was held as to the advisability of setting up a subcommittee to review the psychiatrist's report and recommendation before forwarding them to the court. In a motion made by Dr. Burkes, seconded by Dr. Dunham and carried, it was recommended that a subcommittee of three be established to review these cases prior to referring them to the court and district attorney, this committee to be composed of Drs. Burkes, Wherry, and Erickson, members of the present subcommittee which considers premarital applications.

The Board considered the case of a prisoner in the Malheur County jail convicted on a charge of statutory rape. The psychiatrist who made the examination reported that the prisoner's problem is that of chronic alcoholism; that if this could be controlled, either voluntarily or by aid of treatment, the sex deviations would not likely occur. The Secretary pointed out that a letter had been written to the Judge of the Circuit Court, Malheur County, stating it was the opinion of the Board that no special treatment nor procedures are indicated, since the prisoner is a chronic alcoholic and his sex deviation occurs as the result of this. In a motion made by Dr. Dunham, seconded by Dr. Burkes and carried, the action already taken was confirmed.

The Board then considered the case of Penitentiary convicted on a charge of statutory rape. The psychiatrist who made the examination reported that the prisoner might overcome his schizoid tendencies and sexual perversions if treatment facilities were available and a rehabilitation program could be provided; that if these were not possible, the prisoner should be isolated from society, since sterilization would not offer help. After considering the recommendations of the psychiatrist, a motion was made by Dr. Burkes, seconded by Dr. Wherry and carried, that the prisoner should be castrated before being released from the penitentiary.

The Board considered the premarital application of vate physician had indicated on the form that she appeared to be feebleminded. The Secretary stated that had been requested to appear before the Board at 10:00 a.m. Accordingly, came into the meeting and was interviewed by Dr. Burkes. She was informed that the Board would consider the matter and would let her know its decision. The meeting was called to order by the President. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as mailed to the Board members in a motion made by Dr. Griffith, seconded by Dr. Wherry and carried.

A discussion was held on the matter of reconsidering cases on which considerable time had elapsed between approval by the Board of Eugenics and actual sterilization of the patient and also on the length of time the forms on such cases should be retained in our files. In a motion made by Dr. Wherry, seconded by Dr. Hunt and carried, it was recommended that the action of the Board of Eugenics should stand for five years, after which time the forms should be cleared from the files: that the institution which referred the individual should be informed of this action. In addition, it was agreed that if any of the conditions changed from those originally reported to the Board within this five-year period, the matter should be presented again.

The Board considered the case of sixty-four years of age, who had pleaded guilty to contributing to the delinquency of a minor (involving two small girls) and is confined in the Clackamas County Jail. The case had been referred to the Board of Eugenics by the District Attorney of Clackamas County in accordance with the law. Dr. Waterman reported that the psychiatrist who examined the prisoner did not recommend sterilisation but did recommend very careful supervision, probably on an institutional level. In a motion made by Dr. Burkes, seconded by Dr. Hill and carried, it was recommended that the Board concur in the psychiatrist's recommendation and that the case be referred back to the court for disposition.

Mr. Lister stated that he had reviewed the modified Board of Eugenics forms, which he feels will be more useful and acceptable, and suggested that the present forms be changed accordingly. In a motion made by Dr. Hill, seconded by Dr. Hunt and carried, it was recommended that the modified forms, as approved by Mr. Lister, be adopted and that a supply of these be printed.

I hereby certify that the fine grain film on which the above documents are taken is the slow burning cellulose acetate type, known as safety film and identified by the manufacturer's mark of the work "safety" followed by a small solid triangle printed at intervals along the edge of the film, and which the manufacturer states does not contain more than 0.15 percent nitrogen as cellulose nitrate. In processing this film, it was developed by use of the usual organic developing agents such as "Metol", hydroquinone, glycin, etc., compounded to produce a silver image essentially black. Developers producing stained or colored images have not been used. The film has been fixed in sodium thiosulphate, no fixing bath containing ammonium thiosulphate was used. The hypo (sodium thiosulphate) content of the processed film after washing does not exceed 0.005 mg per square inch of film. No intensification or reduction of the developed image was attempted in the processing of this film. All tests of this film were made according to methods and standards recommended by the National Bureau of Standards.
