RETAIL FOOD PRICES OVER A ONE-YEAR PERIOD

Retail food prices which have been under OPA control since 1942 have been held down to a rise of only 5.4 percent over the one-year period from March 1942 to March 1943. Food prices which did not come under control until October 1942 rose 28 percent, while food still free from Federal regulation on February 15, 1943, jumped nearly 50 percent.

Attached is a table showing the percentage changes in U.S. average retail food prices from March 17, 1942, to March 16, 1943, separating the food items between those controlled as of May 1942, those controlled as October 1942 and those uncontrolled as of February 15, 1943.
