A meeting was called at the U. S. Employment Office, Ontario, Oregon, on September 4, 1942, at 8:00 P. M., for the purpose of adopting uniform regulations for all Japanese Evacuses in the Counties of Mashington, Payette, Gem and Canyon, all in the State of Idaho, and Malhour County, Oregon. There were present at this meeting representatives of the Ear Melocation Board, U. S. Employment Rervice, Farm Security and Law Enforcement Officers from each of the above named Counties. It was agreed at this meeting that the regulations eovering the Japanese Evacuses, heretofore imposed in Malhour County, Oregon, be adopted. Which regulations are as follows:

- All Evecuses shall be subject to a curfew during the hours of 8:00 P. M. to 6:00 A. M. excepting for two days each week. These two days may be such days as are set by the Sherriff of the County, and on these days the hours shall be from 11:00 P. M. to 6:00 A. M. In all cases Saturday Night curfew shall be 8:00 P. M. to 6:00 A. M.
- 2. There shall be no visitors allowed to enter Evecuces' caupa after 8:00 P. M. and all visitors shall be out of the caup not later than 10:00 P. M. except those nights when curfew extends to 11:00 P.M., on which nights there shall be no visiting after 11:00 P. M.
- 3. Evacuees owning private cars and trucks are prohibited from using same for pleasurs; but such cars and trucks, if the necessity arises, may be used for the transportation of workers to and from work or for the transportation of grops and produce, under special permit.
- 4. In cases where the amployment requires that the evaluate be out during curfew hours, special permits may be granted by the Employment Service or commons in authority. Such permits must be carried by the Evacues at all times.
- 5. Any fermer employing and quartering evacuoes on his ferm, is responsible for such evacuoes observing the above curfew hours end regulations. He is also to see that they are accompanied on trips to town.
- The Employment Service of each County is to issue an identification certificate to each Synchrone, bearing his number, description, ste.
- 7. The above regulations apply to <u>all</u> Japanese Evacuess, whether they are living in the Farm Socurity camps or are quartered on individual forms.

It was also suggested that the local Japanese in the various Counties

be contacted and asked to op-operate with the above curfew regulations as fully

as possible.
