Attached is a first draft of proposed ordinance on Victory Gardens issued by the National Institute of Municipal Law Officers and sent to us by our Regional office.

Since local Victory Garden Committees operate as committees of local Defense Councils, we think you may wish to make the attached information available to local Councils.

Although it is likely that the actions made illegal by this ordinance are in many communities already illegal by existing ordinances, there appears to be a psychological value in having a special ordinance on Victory Gardens passed by local County and City governments.

We have been told that many people have hesitated to plant, particularly in community garden plots, for fear someone would steal their crops. The passage of local legislature making interferance with another person's Victory Garden illegal, should stimulate alertness of local law enforcement officers and reassure those who fear losing their crops.

## FIRST DRAFT OF MCDEL ORDINANCE ON VICTORY CARDENS

An Ordinance Providing Penalties for Damaging, Trespassing upon or Stealing from "Victory Cardens," or any other Vegetable Carden or Orchard, Repealing Ordinances in Conflict therewith and Declaring on Emergency.

WHEREAS, An Emergency exists by reason of wer-time conditions now prevailing which have dimished the national and local food supplies; and

whereas, as a part of the War Program, the development, cultivation, and maintenance of "Victory Gardens," or any other vegetables garden or orchard is being encouraged and fostered as a means of increasing the national and local food supply; and

of "Victory Gardens," or any other vegetable garden or orchard located in the City of will be impeded by unauthorized acts of persons who steal from, damage, or trespess upon aforesaid gardens or orchards, now therefore,

Be it ordeined by the Council of the City of \_\_\_\_

SECTION 1. TRESPASSING UPON CARDEN PROPERTY OR ORGHARDS. It shall be unlawful for any person to enter any enclosed or unenclosed "Victory Garden," or any other vegetable garden or orchard located with the City of without consent of the owner, or tenant, or his or her agent, and there cut down, injure, damage, destroy, eat or carry away any portion of said garden, including any growing thing, crop, tree, timber, grass, seed, soil, fertilizer, water supply, tool, implement, fence, or any other protective device or any other thing useful for the development, cultivation, maintenance and use of the aforesaid gardens or orchards.

ordinances of the City of are hereby repealed inspfer as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance. SECTION 3. SEPARABILITY OF PROVISIONS. It is the intention of the City Council that each separate provision of this
Crdinence shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein,
and it is further the intention of the City Council that if any
provisions herein of this Ordinance be declared invalid, all other
provisions thereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

Wer-time conditions have created not only a national but a local shortage of food for the residents of the City of so that it is necessary to protect the public health and promote the general welfare by encouraging and protecting the raising of vegetables and fruits by making this ordinance effective immediately.

SECTION 5. PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS. Any person violeting the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than \_\_\_\_\_, for each offense.
