"Cotton-wood" A Negro center at Vanport - An over-all Recreation program exclusively for the colored people residing at this project will be under the direction of experienced directors. It is estimated that out of the 22,000 people-living at Vanport, 20% are Negroes.

Industrial Recreation

The Kaiser Shipbuilding Corp has built and equipped a Recreation building at their Swan Island Shipyards.

A full-time Recreation Director has been placed in charge and is organizing an over-all Recreation program for these industrial workers.

Portland - A down-town industrial center is being made available in the building known as the old Portland Turnverin Hall and will be dedicated when a competent staff is secured.
