MATIONAL DEFENSE

WHEREAS: The IWA-CIO, along with all Labor throughout the Nation, is ready to answer the call of the greatest union in the world, the Union of the Severeign States of America, and

WHEREAS: It could not of been otherwise than this, for men who have drenched every inch of this Mation with their sweat, yes, and with their blood, do not hold lightly a land which their toil has done so much to build, and

WHEREAS: There has been no hour of crisis in American history in which labor has failed to answer whatever challenges were raised and it will answer the present one, proudly and willingly, to the utmost reaches of its ability, and to the utmost depths of its devotion, and

WHEREAS: As Labor moves to its battle stations on every economic sector of the land, a few men of little faith who doubtes us have learned at last what wiser men have always known, that in any hour of National crisis, Labor will find its own way to unity, and forge a solidarity against which no international Goen Squads can prevail, and

WHEREAS: Labor to-day, is one, one with the tired and gallant man who sits in the White House as a symbol of all our hopes, one with every true American who will bet his life's blood that no distator or combination of distators can ever win, or hold, a square foot of our free soil, and

WHEREAS: Labor will take its place well aware that perfection is found only in Heaven, and that there is still a section or two of this Nation that is scarcely a Heaven, and

WHEREAS: Laber will carry still its bitter recollections of the Coal and Iron Police in Bennsylvania, of different vigilantes committees, of sundry clubbings and shootings, of pell-tax congressmen's venality, of Jim Growism and Lynch law and relief lines, but whatever fires of resentment may still burn at memories such as these, they fade into feeble embers in the fierce light of a world in flames, and Laber, taking its rightfull place, will remember proudly also, that while some of its members bear scars, NOME OF THEM HAVE WORN CHAINS, now therefore be it

RESOLIED: That the membership of IWA-GIO Local Union No. 5-216, go on record pledging all-out on a new picket line, a picket line against universal terrorism, a general strike for the ultimate freedom of the world, and be it further

RESOLVED: That Local Union No. 5-216, as an organisation, and as members thereof, offer full and complete cooperation and assistance to the United States Government, to the State of Oregon, to the county and city in which they live and to the various State and county Defense Councils now established for the defense of our country, and be it finally

RESOLVED: That copies of this resolution be sent to Charles A. Sprague, Governor of the State of Oregon, to Joseph K. Carson, Director General Of Civilian Defense for the Pacific Coast, to Jerry Owens, State Coordinator of Defense and to Howard Merriam, Coordinator of Defense of Lane County, Oregon.
