[EXHIBIT H] LC 284 makes modifications to the Oregon Forest Practices Act and the rule-making authority of the Board of Forestry. [Exhibit I]
- 096 **CHAIR REPINE:** Asked staff to discuss the missing eleven lines that were added into LC 284.
- 097 ADKINS: Most of the seven bills we are now discussing were also part of SB 1156. This bill had eleven lines that were deleted from the bill that passed. Those eleven lines have been restored. LC 285 prohibits local jurisdictions from adopting and enforcing laws and rules regarding pesticides that are more restrictive than state standards but requires the Department of Agriculture to consider local government concerns as they administer the laws. [EXHIBIT J] LC 286 reduces from 10 to 7 miles the required distance from a retail gasoline station to a nonretail facility before they can give a conditional use permit that allows regular customers to use the current law. [EXHIBIT K]
