003 Chair Anderson Calls the meeting to order at 11:52 a.m. Opens a work session on SB 290-A.

**SB 290-A – WORK SESSION**

006 Rep. Jenson **MOTION: Moves SB 290-A to the floor WITHOUT RECOMMENDATION as to passage and BE REFERRED to the committee on Budget by prior reference.**

016 Rep. Nolan States her preference for passing the bill to the House Committee on Budget with a do pass recommendation. Explains that the pesticide reporting program was passed overwhelmingly in a previous legislative session and the committee should show its support for the program with a do pass recommendation.

026 Chair Anderson States that there may be amendments forthcoming that would change the bill. Expresses hesitancy to pass the bill with a do pass recommendation.

030 Rep. Nolan Explains that the recommendation is for the current version of the bill, rather than a potentially amended version.

040 Rep. Barnhart **MOTION: Moves to AMEND the motion to move SB 290-A to the floor WITHOUT RECOMMENDATION as to passage and BE REFERRED to the Committee on Budget by prior reference, by substituting "DO PASS" for "WITHOUT RECOMMENDATION".**

047 Rep. Barnhart States that the reason for his motion is that he concurs with the statements of Rep. Nolan.

**SB 496 – WORK SESSION**

066 John Houser Committee Administrator. Introduces SB 496.

**080 Rep. Jenson MOTION: Moves SB 496 to the floor WITHOUT RECOMMENDATION as to passage and the SUBSEQUENT REFERRAL to the Committee on Ways and Means BE RESCINDED and BE REFERRED to the Committee on Budget.**

**090 Rep. Barnhart MOTION: Moves to AMEND the motion to move SB 496 to the floor WITHOUT RECOMMENDATION as to passage and the SUBSEQUENT REFERRAL to the Committee on Ways and Means BE RESCINDED and BE REFERRED to the Committee on Budget, by substituting "DO PASS" for "WITHOUT RECOMMENDATION".**

095 Rep. Barnhart States support for SB 496 and argues that the bill should be passed to the House Committee on Budget with a do pass recommendation rather than without recommendation.

102 Rep. Rosenbaum Notes support for the bill and lack of opposition. States support for a do pass recommendation.

112 Chair Anderson Notes the concerns of some that private lands may be brought into public possession under SB 496.

125 Rep. Nolan Notes that the bill has no revenue or fiscal impact and since the issue is entirely related to policy, the House Environment Committee as a

policy committee should address the issue or make a recommendation when passing the bill to another committee.
