TAPE 19, A

004 Chair Dallum Calls the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. and opens a work session on HB 2179, which allows the Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) to establish alternative regulatory options for the purpose of encouraging emerging technologies.

HB 2179 – WORK SESSION

006 Dallas Weyand Committee Administrator. Explains that the public hearing on HB 2179 was held February 15, 2005, at which time DCBS representatives discussed the need to adopt alternative regulatory processes for emerging technologies relating to building codes. Reports that there is a subsequent referral to the House Committee on Trade and Economic Development.

024 Rep. Witt **MOTION: Moves HB 2179 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation and BE REFERRED to the committee on Trade and Economic Development by prior reference.**

026 **VOTE: 3-0-2**

EXCUSED: 2 - Krummel, Wirth

029 Chair Dallum **Hearing no objection, declares the motion CARRIED.**

030 Chair Dallum Closes the work session on HB 2179.

033 Weyand Announces there will be no meetings February 24 and March 3. Discusses proposed agendas for March 1 and March 8.

054 Rep. Burley Asks the time of the centralized voter registration system demonstration on March 8.

056 Weyand Responds that he will confirm that it will be during this committee's regular meeting time.

060 Weyand Discusses proposed meeting agendas for March 10, 15 and 17.

094 Weyand Advises that HB 2501, which deals with electronic access to Department of Motor Vehicles records, has been referred to this

committee. Indicates issues are being worked out prior to scheduling for public hearing.

- 106 Rep. Wirth Asks if a review has been made of Senate bills.
- 110 Weyand Responds, yes, but this committee can act only on bills referred to it.
- 111 Chair Dallum Suggests the topic of technology in rural Oregon for a road trip meeting, perhaps in Mitchell, Oregon.
- 130 Chair Dallum Asks about the Oregon Health Plan.
- 132 Weyand States that a report is being finalized and will be brought before this committee. Indicates that a Senate bill is being contemplated on electronic health records.
- 145 Rep. Burley Asks if the proposed legislation will require that the Oregon Health Plan be automated.
- 147 Weyand Responds that the proposal is to set standards for security and accessibility around the state and between states.
- 163 Chair Dallum Comments that there should be cost savings.
- 166 Weyand Indicates that potential savings would result from accessibility to records so duplicate tests or X-rays would not be necessary.
- 176 Chair Dallum Reopens the work session on HB 2179 for the purpose of allowing Rep. Wirth to vote.

HB 2179 – WORK SESSION

- 179 Chair Dallum **MOTION: Requests unanimous consent that the rules be SUSPENDED to allow REP. WIRTH to BE RECORDED as voting AYE on the MOTION to move HB 2179 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation and BE REFERRED to the committee on Trade and Economic Development by prior reference.**
