002 Chair Nelson Opens the meeting at 8:37 a.m. Opens the informational meeting on Veterans' Issues.

VETERANS' ISSUES - INFORMATIONAL MEETING

016	Frank Freyer	Legislative Liaison, Oregon County Veterans' Service Officers Association (OCVSOA). Submits and summarizes written testimony regarding his history as a County Veterans' Service Officers (CVSO) (EXHIBIT A).
051	Freyer	Submits and summarizes financial spreadsheet for the CVSO Pilot Project (EXHIBIT B). Discusses the month-by-month costs and savings associated with moving a veteran receiving state-funded Medicaid benefits to federally-funded Veterans' Benefits.
