013            Kay Tiesl                              Oregon Cattlemen’s Association. Submits written testimony **(EXHIBIT A)** and testifies in support of SB 185 A.

021            Chair Jenson                      Closes public hearing on SB 185 A. Opens a public hearing on SB 594.

025            Russ Stauff                              Legislative Liaison, Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW). Submits written testimony **(EXHIBIT B)** and testifies in support of SB 594.

062            Rep. Krummel                      Questions the effect if the bag limits in Oregon and Washington were different.

075            Stauff                                      Clarifies that bag limits are currently different in Oregon and Washington. Defers to Dave Cleary.

081            Dave Cleary                              Oregon State Fisheries Section. Explains that a person will be held to the bag limit in whichever state they launch from and return to.

103            Rep. Krummel                      Inquires if there is a reason why Oregon and Washington do not have a common bag limit.

112            Cleary                                      Relates that the bag limit is being considered for reciprocity.

133            Chair Jenson                              Comments on reciprocity.

159	Stauff	States that common bag limits have been reached on other species.
163	Chair Jenson	Comments on endangered species and allowing Washington anglers preferential treatment.
190	Stauff	Offers to get back to the committee.
192	Rep. Krummel	Inquires if the bag limit doubles for licensed Oregon anglers if they fish from Washington.
200	Cleary	States that an Oregon licensed angler in Washington waters can fish with Washington's higher limit. Explains why Oregon has chosen to set bag limit to two fish total.

323 Rep. Barnhart Inquires what the vote was on the original motion.

327 Sandy Thiele-Cirka Explains that the bill as amended by the -3 amendments was passed unanimously.

336 Rep. Krummel Recalls that it was sent without recommendation, and states that it is being sent to the House Committee on Budget in the same fashion.

348 Rep. Dingfelder Clarifies that the -3 amendments were a gut and stuff.
