005 Chair Deckert Calls meeting to order at 1:27 p.m. and opens the work session on SB 1083.

**SB 1083 - WORK SESSION**

012 **Sen. Metsger** **MOTION: Moves to ADOPT SB 1083-5 amendments dated 7/8/05.**  
016 Sen. Metsger States that SB 1083-5 amendments (**EXHIBIT 1**) revert back to the original bill introduced by Sen. Schrader. Explains that all the farm issues are included except for equine stabling, horse shows, and greyhound racing.  
035 Sen. C. Starr States support for the -5 amendments.  
036 Chair Deckert States that the sunset was inadvertently omitted in the -5 amendments and will check with legislative counsel to see it can be added conceptually.  
043 Sen. George Declares a conflict of interest.  
052 Chair Deckert Closes the work session on SB 1083 and opens the work session on HB 3481B (**EXHIBIT 3**).

**HB 3481B – WORK SESSION**

061 **Sen. Metsger** **MOTION: Moves to ADOPT HB 3481B-19 amendments dated 7/7/05.**  
062 **VOTE: 5-0-0**  
**Chair Deckert** **Hearing no objection, declares the motion CARRIED.**  
066 **Sen. Metsger** **MOTION: Moves HB 3481B to the floor with a DO PASS AS AMENDED recommendation.**  
070 Sen. C. Starr Predicts the bill will end up in conference committee and announces a potential minority report.  
060 **VOTE: 4-1-0**  
**AYE: 4 - George, Metsger, Prozanski, Deckert**  
**NAY: 1 - Starr C.**  
**Chair Deckert** **The motion CARRIES.**  
**SEN. DECKERT will lead discussion on the floor.**  
087 Chair Deckert Closes the work session on HB 3481B and re-opens the work session on SB 1083.

**SB 1083 – WORK SESSION**

090	Paul Warner	Legislative Revenue Officer. Refers to the preliminary revenue impact statement and the chart showing the credit against increases in minimum wage ( <b>EXHIBIT 2</b> ). States the complicating issue on the sunset is the carry forward.
094	Chair Deckert	States to Mr. Johnson that the intent is to have the bill end in 2010.
096	Dexter Johnson	Legislative Counsel Office. Asks if the credit is to end completely as of that date, or if a person claims it for the first year in 2009 would there be a five year carry forward for that person.
105	Chair Deckert	Rephrases the question and asks for the committee's input.
107	Committee Members	Indicate that they want the carry forward.
112	Chair Deckert	States the carry forward will be for five years and there is a 2010 sunset.
115	Johnson	Notes that the first year of the credit can be up to 2010. There would be no credit except for carry forward.
118	Chair Deckert	Notes that the qualification would end with the sunset date.
126	Sen. Metsger	<b>MOTION: Moves to CONCEPTUALLY AMEND the -5 amendments to SB 1083A dated 7/8/05 that includes the sunset on the credit being qualified for as of January 1 2010 but credits qualified prior to that can be carried forward for up to five years past the date of the original qualification.</b>
139	Sen. Prozanski	Asks if a person qualifies the second year before it ends, that person would have five years from when they entered into the program not five years from the ending date.
144	Warner	States the credit is allowed after 1/1/2006 and before 1/1/2011 and any credits earned during that period are eligible for up to five years.
149	Chair Deckert	Asks does the clock start on the five year carry forward if you qualified in 2007.
151	Warner	It applies to the tax year you receive the credit and could use it up to 2012.
158	Sen. Metsger	Further clarifies that the sunset is January 1, 2010.
166	Johnson	Notes that if it is transferred they too have the five year carry forward.
170	Sen. Prozanski	Confirms transfers are limited to five years from origination.
187	Chair Deckert	<b>VOTE: 5-0-0</b> <b>Hearing no objection, declares the motion CARRIED.</b>
191	Sen. Metsger	<b>MOTION: Moves SB 1083 to the floor with a DO PASS AS AMENDED by the -5 amendments and the CONCEPUTAL AMENDMENTS.</b>
193	Chair Deckert	<b>VOTE: 5-0-0</b> <b>Hearing no objection, declares the motion CARRIED.</b> <b>SEN. SCHRADER will lead discussion on the floor.</b>
197	Chair Deckert	Closes the work session on SB 1083A and adjourns the meeting at 1:55 p.m.
