056 Sen. Ferrioli Believes if someone is willing to lie to the general public, they would be willing to lie to a publisher.

058 Neely Agrees. Explains HB 3468 would absolve the publisher of potential liability and would assist a consumer in taking action against an individual providing false information. Believes HB 3468 to be a benefit.

139 Henry Replies if the plant is no longer used and useful.

140 Sen. Ferrioli Notes the core has been removed, but all the fissionable materials are still stored on the site. Verifies the materials will be stored on that site indefinitely.

142 Henry Replies they do not know. Explains that is one of the reasons for HB 3479.

143 Sen. Ferrioli States there has been no national repository approved for the storage of nuclear waste. Explains that until a national repository is approved, the fissionable materials are sequestered at the site. Asks if witness knows what the half-life is for the fissionable materials.

147 Henry Replies no.

148 Sen. Ferrioli States it is 250,000 years for the first half-life and it takes 20 half-lives to take fissionable material to inert so it is no longer harmful to human health. Wonders what share of the liability for the Trojan nuclear waste repository the city of Portland will have if the city purchases PGE.

153 Henry Replies 67.5 percent. Explains the decommissioning fund was built up when the plant was used and useful so there were rates coming from customers of PGE that benefited from the production of power at that time.

158 Sen. Ferrioli Verifies there is a reserve.

159 Henry Replies yes. Explains it wouldn't matter who purchases PGE. Adds the only exception would be if the stock was distributed, in which case there would be no change in administration and this would not be an issue.

162 Sen. Ferrioli Points out the important distinction is that if the city of Portland purchases PGE, there will be another group of people that will be

		obligated to pay. Wonders who pays if the ratepayers fail in their duty to pay.
165	Henry	Explains a failsafe incorporated in the bill is that the rates can be increased to ensure that they do pay.
166	Sen. Ferrioli	Verifies that if the city of Portland purchases PGE they would be obligating the taxpayers if there was a default by the company. Verifies the city of Portland would own PGE.
172	Chair Brown	Replies the city of Portland would be financially responsible.
173	Sen. Ferrioli	Discusses the possibility and outcomes of people of Portland owning and being responsible for a nuclear waste repository.
184	Henry	Believes Portland will transfer the bonds and the responsibility for the utility to a regional authority. Explains the result of this negotiation.
191	Sen. Ferrioli	Understands the wisdom of spreading the liability over the largest pool of people. Points out that currently a private sector group of stockholders is wholly responsible, but after the purchase, taxpayers will be responsible.
196	Henry	States the Federal Nuclear Regulatory Commission will have something to say about the transfer of the license. Explains that concluding who is wholly responsible at this point in time is premature. Explains HB 3479 is a failsafe for the city of Eugene.
199	Chair Brown	Remarks Sen. Ferrioli should come to Portland to discuss his concerns.
205	Sen. Ferrioli	States he supports HB 3479, but hopes the citizens of Portland understand the liability that comes along with owning a portion of PGE.
