121	Chair Gordly	Indicates that New York has had a year of experience selling fire- safe cigarettes. Asks if there has been a reduction in cigarette related fires and deaths.
132	Mr. Whalen	Responds that it is too early to tell as they just completed their first year.
136	Chair Gordly	Asks the next two speakers to come forward.
138	Deborah Buchanan, Dept. of Revenue	Indicates that the Dept. is neutral on the issue. Offers to provide current revenue impacts.
