003	Chair Gordly	Calls the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m. Opens a work session on HB 3124 (Exhibit #1). Welcomes Sen. Winters.
HB 3124 B – Relating to court fees – WORK SESSION		
024	John Borden, Legislative Fiscal Office	Refers to (Exhibit #2, Staff Measure Summaries – 7/13/05, 6/27/05, 2/16/05 - on HB 3124B, measure history, and fiscal analysis from John Borden). Provides information on HB 3124B. Notes timing issue regarding loss of state's general fund.
069	Sen. Devlin	MOTION: Moves HB 3124B to full budget committee with a DO PASS recommendation.
072	Chair Gordly	Vote: 3-0-0 Hearing no objections, motion CARRIES . Sen. Winters will lead discussion in the full committee.
079	Chair Gordly	Closes work session on HB 3124B. Opens a work session on SB 907A (Exhibit #3) and SB 5630 (Exhibit #8).
SB 907 A – Relating to Controlled Substances – Methamphetamine Package – WORK SESSION		
081	Doug Wilson, Legislative Analyst	Refers to (Exhibit #4, memorandum dated 7/12/05), (Exhibit # 5, staff measure summaries dated 6/24/05), (Exhibit #6, funding table), and (Exhibit #7, –A6 amendments dated 7/12/05). Describes background and provisions for SB 907A. Comments on workgroup priorities.
119	Wilson	Reviews table for funding (Exhibit #6). Recommends process for distributing funding. Describes distribution of funds.
176	Wilson	Continues explanation of provisions for funding.
186	Chair Gordly	Asks Sen. Burdick to comment. Acknowledges work on the methamphetamine (meth) package.
200	Sen. Ginny Burdick	Senate District 18. Introduces Heidi Moawad and Joe O'Leary, Judiciary staff. Comments on the package as two bills – SB 907A and HB 2485A. Notes emphasis on meth manufacturing and precursor drugs.
242	Sen. Burdick	Emphasizes importance of treatment for meth users through treatment programs and drug courts. Comments on Budget figures.
270	Chair Gordly	Questions where HB 2485A is in the process.
274	Wilson	States that HB 2485A will be heard on Friday, moving at the same rate as SB 907A.
280	Chair Gordly	Inquires if Sen. Burdick would like to carry the bills.

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283	Burdick	Accepts. Relates that Sen. Beyer sends his regrets for not being in the hearing today.
289	Chair Gordly	Comments on the bipartisan effort on the meth package.
295	Sen. Winters	Expresses gratitude to Sen. Beyer, Sen. Burdick and Rep. Macpherson for their work. Comments on efforts since 1999 to come to this point with bipartisan support. States that legislators can work and reason together to benefit Oregonians.
328	Burdick	Thanks Sen. Winters for her efforts.
332	Sen. Devlin	Adds his praise to the workgroup, as well. Suggests that an interim Judiciary committee and other groups analyze the results of this package and present findings to the next legislative assembly.
349	Sen. Winters	Comments on dollar figures in the meth package for families and children.
361	Burdick	Points out that there are provisions for treatment and prevention. Comments on the decision to inconvenience a few in order to save the lives of many children.
372	Chair Gordly	Illustrates the urgency of the issue with the recent story of a child from a meth home who wandered alone near a busy street ("The little round faces of meth," <i>The Oregonian</i> , 7/9/05).
380	Sen. Devlin	Realizes that the prescription will present some difficulty, but does believe that the medical community will work with patients. Relates personal example of a standing prescription for his chronic sinus infections. States that the inconvenience to the individual is worth the benefits.
406	Burdick	Comments on effective alternatives (phenylephrine).
