<u>SB 630 – PUBLIC HEARING</u>		
020	Marjorie Taylor	Administrators. Explains the bill, and the -2, -3, -5, -6 amendments (EXHIBIT A).
044	Gary Schnabel	Executive Director, Oregon Board of Pharmacy. Testifies that SB 630 creates no new authority, and it does not create any new data. Main reason to bring to the legislature is for funding for a new program, and the other is for a process to protect the information. Submits written response to concerns expressed from the March 27, 2003 hearing (EXHIBIT B).
098	Schnabel Sen. Fisher	Gives brief explanation of -2, -3, and -5, amendments. Asks for clarification on dispensing and prescribing physicians.
125	Schnabel	Advises each amendment is written as a stand alone document. Reviews the -6 amendment which is written to correct a misprint in the bill.
	Allan Dulwick	Member of the Oregon Board of Pharmacy. Here to answer questions.
140	Andrea Meyer	ACLU. Testifies in opposition to the bill, and expresses concern on the data collection and how the data would be used. Reviews a section of the bill which allows release of data to a Federal agency.
	Meyer	Testifies further on use of any data for end of life treatment.
177	Sen. Minnis Chair Morrisette	Asks question on release of data. Closes public hearing on SB 630. Advises we will review and may return for further action.
