003	Chair Minnis	Calls the meeting to order at 8:07 a.m. and opens a public hearing on HB 2756A.
<b><u>HB 2756A PUBLIC HEARING</u></b>		
012	Peter Deuel	Oregon District Attorneys Association. Testifies in support of HB 2756A that modifies provisions relating to relief from requirement to report as sex offender based on juvenile adjudication.
062	Sen. Ringo	Asks about the 5-year period to petition for relief.
071	Deuel	Explains two windows of opportunity to file for relief.
077	Sen. Ringo	Asks why there needs to be a deadline.
080	Deuel	Says the record gets stale after a period of time.
099	Sen. Ringo	Asks what kind of evidence is needed for filing a petition.
102	Deuel	Gives examples of evidence.
158	Sen. Starr	Believes that relaxing the requirement to get relief is important.
187	Sen. Ringo	Asks what the purpose is of registration of sex offenders.
196	Deuel	Thinks that people have an interest in being aware of offenders in their communities. Says it is also an issue of public safety.
265	Sen. Ringo	Expresses concern about juveniles having to be registered sex offenders and the damage it causes to the juvenile.
308	Kelly Skye	Oregon Criminal Defense Lawyers Association. Testifies in support of HB 2756A.
335	Sen. Ringo	Says he believes there should be an opportunity for relief without a deadline.

352 Skye Says she agrees. Discusses the need for registration.  
414 Sen. Walker Would like to see court-appointed counsel available.  
426 Skye Says at this time the cost is too great, but would like to see this addressed again when there are funds available.

**VOTE: 6-0**
