064	Sen. Ferrioli	States that he supports SB 819, but expresses concern that it is going to the floor while SB 747 is going to Ways and Means. Discusses federal timber dollars and refers members to letter from Congress regarding federal timber funds. Exhibit 1.
093	Sen. Corcoran	States that he supports leaving the school funding formula alone even if it meant putting the federal timber money back into the fund in the same proportion.
101	Sen. Ringo	Objects to the notion that SB 819 is related to SB 747 because SB 747 is taking federal money and not providing a local option.

115	Sen. Starr	States that he doesn't see any similarity between SB 819 and SB 747 because one provides a local community option to raise taxes, while the other would take money out of many local school districts.
126	Sen. Ferrioli	Agrees that there is no direct connection and that is why he is supporting SB 819. Discusses why SB 747 deserves support and suggests that obtaining federal funds was a local initiative similar to a local option.
154	Sen. Hannon	States that he wishes people wanting a local option would aggressively be trying to repeal measure 5. Asserts that the committee has turned the school funding issue into a rural vs. urban problem when they should be looking at the state as a whole.
205	Sen. Deckert	Responds that ultimately he hopes the committee will come to a grand solution on the education funding problem that is statewide and comprehensive.
225	Sen. Deckert	ORDER: ROLL CALL VOTE: MOTION PASSES: 6-0-0. SENATORS ANSWERING AYE: CORCORAN, HANNON, RINGO, STARR, FERRIOLI, DECKERT. Sen. Devlin will carry the bill on the Senate Floor.

230	Meyer	Explains SB 747, which would take the increase in federal timber funds since 2000-2001 and distribute it outside the formula to local districts.
245	Sen. Ferrioli	Compares SB 747 to an income tax in metropolitan areas.
262	Sen. Starr	States that the difference between SB 747 and the income tax in Multnomah County is that Multnomah County is not taking money away from other districts. Asserts that the legislature should be asking the question whether all money raised outside the funding formula should be put in the pot.
300	Sen. Ferrioli	Points out that rural communities defeated Measure 5 and states that they need to be looking more broadly at the formula issue which is why SB 747 should be sent to Ways and Means.
333	Sen. Deckert	States that he is going to vote no on SB 747 because of the content of the bill and that he hopes to find a statewide solution.
