050	Paul Warner	Explains SB 313-3 amendments and other possible amendments. Exhibit 2.
090	Veronica Rinard	Explains why they have chosen to use SB 313 rather than SB 79 and discusses why this bill is important. Gives data from two studies done on the economic impact from the Production Investment Fund. Refer to written testimony. Exhibit 3.
155	Megan Ratzow	Testifies in support of SB 313 and gives personal account of the film industry and how the bill would positively impact the economy.

230 Sen. Deckert States that they will bring the bill back on Monday with new amendments.

OPENS PUBLIC HEARING ON HB 2213

265	Richard Yates	Explains HB 2213 which allows the Treasury to issue grant anticipation revenue bonds at the request of the Department of Transportation for financing transportation projects that are eligible to receive federal transportation funds. Exhibit 5.
285	Dave Tyler	Testifies in support of HB 2213 and discusses the substantive changes it makes. Refer to written testimony. Exhibit 6.
325	Sen. Deckert	States that he has been told the Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicle Bonds (GARVEEs) are not a good deal.
328	Tyler	Responds that the highway user tax revenue bonds are a better credit and that you pay a higher premium with GARVEE bonds.
335	Sen. Ringo	Asks if the bonds are backed by federal funds.
338	Tyler	Responds positively.
340	Sen. Ringo	Asks how much money the state gets from the funds that are subject to GARVEE bonding.
344	Tyler	Responds that the Department of Transportation receives approximately \$300 million over a biennium.
350	Sen. Ringo	Asks if they currently spend that stream of revenue since they aren't using it for bonding.
354	Tyler	Responds positively.
360	Sen. Ringo	Asks why it doesn't make more sense to live off the stream of revenue.
370	Tyler	Responds that ODOT has traditionally used current revenues, but that there are serious problems with the infrastructure that wouldn't get fixed by using the revenue.
395	Sen. Deckert	Asks if this bill would be a policy switch from using revenues to a bonding scheme that would jeopardize future revenues and if this causes concern.
405	Tyler	Responds that it is a fundamental policy shift, but that they have a great deal of protection in bond restrictions.
425	Douglas Goe	Responds that even if a significant package goes forward, there would still be a significant amount of revenue used on a pay as you go basis. Discusses interest rates and the highway user tax program. Testifies in support of HB 2213 and discusses the intentions.

130	Sen. Deckert	Asks about lottery bonding.
135	Goe	Responds that lottery bonds are much more volatile, making the criteria for coverage higher.
170	Sen. Ringo	Asks what Goe's firm makes on the issuance of bonds.
175	Goe	Responds that they are paid on an hourly basis at a substantially discounted rate.
		Discussion follows.
