046 Nan Heim Testifies in support of HB 3062 because under current economic and budget conditions, many libraries would not qualify for Ready to Read grants without the short term suspension of the requirement. Refer to written testimony. Exhibit 2.

079 Jim Schepcke Testifies in support of HB 3062 because it would allow all Oregon libraries to receive a Ready to Read grant in 2003-05. Discusses the Ready to Read program. Refer to written testimony. Exhibit 3.

096 Sen. Deckert Asks the bill needs to go to Ways and Means.

103 Heim Responds that there is no fiscal impact.

169 Malik Explains HB 2030 and the -3 amendments. See Exhibit 3 from 4/24/03 meeting.

218 Sen. Hannon Asks if the amendment puts city and county governments at the end of the collection line, behind lawyer fees.

245 Diane Belt Responds that the attorneys are always the first to receive fees, but that if they did not hire outside counsel, they would receive nothing at all.

276 Sen. Deckert Asks why they are lower in the pecking order and if there is anything they can do statutorily to change that.

280 Sen. Hannon Responds that it is because of federal bankruptcy laws.

Discussion follows.

315 Sen. Deckert Asks why the Department of Revenue doesn't try to solve this problem on a statewide level, by consolidating costs.

320 Belt Responds that they would have to talk to the Department of Revenue.

339 Sen. Deckert Suggests that they look into that after testing it out through this bill.

Discussion follows.

374 Sen. Hannon MOTION: MOVES HB 2030-3 AMENDMENTS DATED 4/24/03 BE ADOPTED.

379 Sen. Deckert ORDER: HEARING NO OBJECTION, MOTION PASSES: 6-0-0.

384 Sen. Hannon MOTION: MOVES HB 2030 TO THE SENATE FLOOR WITH A DO PASS AS AMENDED RECOMMENDATION.

390 Sen. Deckert ORDER: HEARING NO OBJECTION, MOTION PASSES: 6-0-0.  
Sen. Corcoran will carry the bill on the Senate Floor.
