013	Mike Dewey	Discusses history and offers support for HB 2399 because the tax, which adds up to over 10 percent, was found to be Unconstitutional in court. Notes that it has been found Unconstitutional interstate.
065	Sen. Deckert	Asks about if a recent event at the Rose Garden would have qualified for the tax.
068	Dewey	Responds that it was high profile, but not a pay-per-view event.
090	Pete Shepherd	Adds to the discussion on the court case decision.
115	Sen. Deckert	Asks what will happen if they don't pass the bill.
120	Shepherd	Predicts that any litigation against them would be successful.

182	Sen. Hannon	States that there was another bill that dealt with a separate issue that passed out of the Senate last week and that it is their obligation to pass this out.
190	Mazen Malik	Notes that the –B9 amendments need to be adopted to resolve conflicts.
195	Sen. Hannon	MOTION: MOVES HB 2379-B9 AMENDMENTS DATED 5/30/03 BE ADOPTED.
200	Sen. Deckert	ORDER: HEARING NO OBJECTION, MOTION PASSES: 4-0-2. SENATORS EXCUSED: CORCORAN, STARR.
205	Sen. Hannon	MOTION: MOVES HB 2379 B TO THE SENATE FLOOR WITH A DO PASS AS AMENDED RECOMMENDATION.
208	Sen. Ferrioli	States that this bill was being held hostage with another bill and that he is happy to support the motion.
222	Sen. Ringo	Agrees with Sen. Ferrioli that this bill should be moved as soon as possible.
230	Sen. Deckert	ORDER: HEARING NO OBJECTION, MOTION PASSES: 4-0-2. SENATORS EXCUSED: CORCORAN, STARR. Sen. Carter will carry the bill on the Senate Floor.

#### **OPENS PUBLIC HEARING ON HB 3582**

240	Rep. Hunt	Testifies in support of HB 3582 because it would provide accountability for the study being done. Addresses suggestion that the bill be changed into the form of a budget note.
270	Jon Oshel	Testifies that the Association of Oregon Counties recognizes the need for the study and supports the bill.
285	Sen. Hannon	Asks who is supposed to be paying for the study.
298	Oshel	Responds that the current plan is to fund the study through revenues currently within the Association of Oregon Counties' budget.
307	Sen. Hannon	States that he doesn't understand how they are coming up with this large amount of money when they are always asking the Legislature for more. Asks about the jurisdiction the Association of Counties has over ODOT and other agencies.

322	Rep. Hunt	Responds that the workgroup would not have the authority to direct other agencies, but the agencies would be directed to assist the workgroup through this legislation.
330	Sen. Ringo	Asks what sort of legal entity the association of Oregon counties is.
333	Oshel	Responds that they are a public agency but not under the state.
343	Rep. Hunt	Responds that there are several places in statute where they direct organizations that receive public funds but are not state agencies.
358	Warner	Clarifies that the legislature does have the authority to direct agencies that are using state money.
362	Sen. Ringo	States that it is his opinion that the state could decide where money given the agencies should go, but not to direct them in their general operations.
