003	Chair Williams	Calls the meeting to order at 1:10 p.m. and opens a work session on SB 293B. Discusses –B5 amendments (EXHIBIT A).
<u>SB 293B WORK SESSION</u>		
014	Counsel Taylor	Introduces SB 293B that creates 24-month presumptive sentence for repeat offender convicted of aggravated theft in first degree.
034	Kevin Mannix	Attorney, Salem Testifies in support of SB 293B and –B5 amendments and discusses compromise of interested parties.
057	Rep. Ringo	Says that he would like more background on the compromise.
064	Chair Williams	Explains compromise as the –B5 amendments and the support of the Governor.
094	Rep. Ringo	Says that he would like to know more about Oregon's problem of repeat property offenders.
092	Mannix	States that we do have a very serious problem with repeat property offenders in Oregon. Says that a significant portion of our serious property crimes come from repeat offenders because the offenders know their sentence will be probation.
123	Rep. Dingfelder	Asks Mr. Mannix how this bill will impact Oregon's prison space.
128	Mannix	Answers that there are two impacts to consider—state prison space and county jail space. Says there will be a positive impact on county jails because the repeat offenders will go straight to state prison and that the state has a physical capacity to

148	Rep. Lowe	accommodate those inmates. Adds that there will be a \$2 million fiscal impact in the next biennium.
161	Mannix	Asks Mr. Mannix about repeat drug offender measures this session.
206	Rep. Shetterly	Answers that he supported that legislation and discusses issue. MOTION: Moves to ADOPT SB 293-B5 amendments dated 06/19/01. VOTE: 10-0-1 EXCUSED: 1 - C. Walker
213	Chair Williams	Hearing no objection, declares the motion CARRIED.
223	Rep. Shetterly	MOTION: Moves SB 293B to the floor with a DO PASS AS AMENDED recommendation. VOTE: 9-1-1 AYE: 9 - Ackerman, Backlund, Krieger, Lowe, Ringo, Shetterly, Walker V, Wilson, Williams NAY: 1 - Dingfelder EXCUSED: 1 - Walker C
224	Chair Williams	The motion CARRIES. REP. WILLIAMS will lead discussion on the floor.
231	Chair Williams	Closes the work session on SB 293B and adjourns the meeting at 1:30 p.m.
