004	Chair Duncan	Calls meeting to order and opens public hearing HB 2212 A.
<u>HB 2212 A PUBLIC HEARING</u>		
007	Cheryl Pellegrini	Department of Justice. Testifies in support of HB 2212 A. Submits and refers to written material (EXHIBIT A). Comments that HB 2212 A accomplishes two purposes: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. It carries out the intent of the "No Call" law by making certain that information other than a party's telephone number is not subject to disclosure under the Public Records Law. While the Department of Justice believes that at least two existing exemptions could apply to keep this information confidential, a specific exemption would eliminate any uncertainty and insure that the privacy of consumers is protected.2. HB 2212 A authorizes the List Administrator to add to the List the names of the persons, along with their registered phone numbers(s).
052	Craig Campbell	Oregon Association Chief's of Police. Testifies in support of HB 2212 A. Submits and refers to written material (EXHIBIT B). States this bill will benefit smaller solicitation firms, including those that solicit donations for Special Olympics and Oregon Association of Chief's of Police, who operate through phone books have a tedious task of finding the telephone in the phone book and manually deleting the numbers.

081	Sen. Metsger	Discusses the older provisions from the “No Call” list. What happens if someone doesn’t want to receive any solicitations.
105	Pellegrini	Responds they did not seek to amend the older provisions of the “black dot law”. Comments they would not be opposed to fewer exemptions if they would provide better protection to consumers.
109	Sen. Metsger	Comments this exemption would be an affirmative action on the part of the consumer and not a government action.
114	Pellegrini	Responds the original provisions related to cold calls. States the Intent was to attain something they did not ask for.
123	Sen. Metsger	Expresses some confusion that could occur during election solicitation calls when automated calls are made to consumers who are on a do not call list.
132	Pellegrini	States their office did receive some complaints during the election and were told they could not block those calls.
143	Duncan	Closes public hearing HB 2212 A and opens a work session.

States these are minor changes in provisions that would permit the department and the investments to be used for infrastructures that lead to advances in Oregon’s knowledge based and technology based industries.
