005 Chair Ferrioli Meeting called to order at 8:35 a.m.

017 Paul Warner Discussed SB 509. The bill modifies the

distance for remote small elementary schools to qualify for additional student weight. It changes the minimum distance from 8 miles to the nearest elementary school to 8 miles to the nearest elementary school in the same school

district. Exhibits 1 and 2.

Questions and answers interspersed.

O33 Chair Ferrioli Advised members that change in the funding

formula will be felt by the entire ADMw across the state. It will redistribute funds. Reminded committee members that the 20 schools to benefit from passage of this bill have been constrained by an artificial ceiling that prevented them from participating in the small school distribution because they were within 8 miles of another elementary school, regardless if that other school was in another school district. Believes this is the first reasonable step toward addressing the entire small school issue.

OPENED PUBLIC HEARING ON SB 509

099 Randy Testified in support of SB 509. Read written Hildebrand testimony on behalf of Sen. Bev Clarno.

151 Dr. Peter Tarzian Testified in support of SB 509. Discussed

Exhibit 5. Said that SB 509 is focused on placing the 20 small schools, left out of the correction process because of proximity, on equal footing with the rest of the small schools that are receiving the correction. This is an equity issue, and a fairness issue.

Questions and answers followed.

242 Sen. Castillo Stated that the entire school system is under-

funded, and will not reduce funding to other schools just to benefit these 20. Thinks the \$3.3 million should come from another source.

263 Chair Ferrioli Advised the committee that, in fact, support for

the entire system comes from the small schools. All schools, except the 20 addressed in SB 509

have already been adjusted down.

296 Sen. Minnis Contrary to Sen. Castillo's view, feels the

school system is over-funded. Wants to help

these 20 small schools.

343 Sandy McNabb Testified in support of SB 509.

454 Chair Ferrioli Accepted the responsibility of returning to the

committee with formula adjustments that will

be administered to all the funding bills.

Thanked Sen. Minnis for his support of this bill.

Will support this bill, but agrees with Sen. Castillo. Feels one group should not be disadvantaged for the benefit of another. Feels the \$3.3 million should be found elsewhere to support these 20 schools.

Stated if the \$3.3 million to supplement the 20 schools could be found without taking it from already severely under-funded school districts she would support the bill. However, since that is not the case, she will not support this bill.

The (-2) amendments require boundary changes for establishment of a tax zone to be recorded in final form with the county assessor and Department of Revenue.
