<p>This informational trip to the Sabin Skills Center in Milwaukie was not recorded. The committee was greeted by the Director, Ronald Dexter, who presented an overview of the 17 programs offered at the Center. (EXHIBIT A) The Center is a regional professional/technical center for elective courses. It accommodates approximately 2,000 high school students each day in four shifts of 500 students who are bussed from their respective high school to the Center. The Center will double in size in the future as the result of a recent bond issue. All teachers at the Center are certified and hold a professional/technical license issued by the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (TSPC). The committee heard a brief presentation by marketing class students (EXHIBIT B). The marketing education course is a nationally accredited</p>

model program by the National Marketing Education Resource Center.

The committee took a tour of several labs and heard brief presentations by students in Information Technology, Telecommunications Systems, Distance Learning, Graphics Technology, Manufacturing Engineering, and Nursery/Landscaping.

No bills were discussed or official action taken.
