<b><u>HB 2220 WORK SESSION</u></b>		
005	Chair Mannix	HB 2220 was sent to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation knowing the Speaker would rescind the referral to Ways & Means. The proper action is a motion to rescind the referral to Ways & Means. I think HB 2220 needs to go to Ways & Means because money is re-appropriated.
024	Rep. Prozanski	The money already deposited in the Department of Corrections account should stay in the account, not revert to the General Fund. Isn't this consistent with other dedicated accounts?
030	Chair Mannix	Yes. I will have Counsel Horton check with Ways & Means to see if a referral is necessary.
046	Rep. Prozanski	I would ask counsel to clarify if this is standard language for any agency accounts that have dedicated funds going into those accounts. Should the Department of Corrections be contacted for clarification on this same question?

The agency went from being managed by a Board to becoming a full state agency, the Department of Public Safety Standards & Training, after the 1997 Legislative Session. Explains that duties were distributed between the Board and the Department and SB 346 includes two of those duties that should be directed to the Department, not the Board.
