192	Chair Strobeck	Does Washington and other states have similar inspectors that come to Oregon to look for the same thing?
200	Miller	There are people who come from out of state to visit Oregon mills. Discussed why the interest has increased since 1989 when the law first passed.
215	Chair Strobeck	How do you know the log is cut in Oregon?
219	Miller	The records will provide subtle differences, but sometimes it is questionable. The bill would allow in the terms of an audit to compare Oregon returns with information provided in Washington or other states.
234	Chair Strobeck	The basic purpose of the bill is to be sure Oregon gets information and reciprocity is a ticket to that?
239	Miller	Concurred.
