003	Chair Mannix	Calls the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m.
<b><u>HB 2479B WORK SESSION</u></b>		
004	Counsel Horton	Introduces the ñB10, ñB11 and ñB12 amendments to HB 2479B that adopts amendments to rules of the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission ranking and classifying crimes created and modified by sixth-ninth Legislative Assembly <b>(EXHIBITS A ñ C)</b> . The ñB10 amendments have no specified operative date; it takes affect at the same time as the bill. The ñB11 amendments have an operative date of July 1, 2001 and the ñB12 amendments leave the operative date blank.

019	Chair Mannix	Discusses how prior convictions will be calculated under this legislation.
024	Rep. Edwards	Are we setting a new precedent?
026	Chair Mannix	This procedure is currently used with Ballot Measure 11 offenses.
030	<b>Phil Lemman</b>	<b>Oregon Criminal Justice Commission</b>  The safest course is to adopt the July 1, 2001 operative date as proposed in the ñB11 amendments. Adopting this amendment would also avoid a referral to Ways and Means this session.
<b>044</b>	<b>Rep. Edwards</b>	<b>MOTION: Moves to ADOPT HB 2479B-11 amendments dated 07/07/99.</b>
		<b>VOTE: 6-0</b>
	<b>Chair Mannix</b>	<b>Hearing no objection, declares the motion CARRIED.</b>
<b>048</b>	<b>Rep. Edwards</b>	<b>MOTION: Moves HB 2479B to the floor with the recommendation that the House concur in Senate amendments dated 06/10/99 and that the bill be further amended by the ñB11 amendments and the measure be repassed.</b>
050	Sen. Nelson	States that he will be voting "no" because of the fiscal impact.
053	Chair Mannix	Discusses the importance of stronger sanctions for repeat property offenders and including prior convictions as part of that stronger sanction.
061	Rep. Edwards	States that the issue of property crime is important to his district.
