The bill will allow public owned utilities to enter into transactions regarding the purchase of power through financial instruments. Presents (EXHIBIT E).  |

| 296                  | Cable            | Responds explaining eliminating variation and price risk in regard to electricity. Says this bill does not authorize buying electricity for the purpose of making money. The transaction must be for the purchase of electricity required for load. It must minimize the risk in regard to market price fluctuations. Gives the example of a public utility that wants to buy electricity from the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA). Explains that going into the market, the utility must pay to meet the load. |

| 365                  | Cable            | Answers the agreement can be called a swap, a collar, a cap, or a contract.   |

| 070       | Cable        | Answers there will be a statement saying there will be no higher price, a cap is set.   |
| 094       | Sherry Sheng | Committee Administrator. Asks what is the down side of the financial instruments.   |
| 098       | Cable        | Says if you buy in the down months, you will spend more.  |
| 105       | Chair Nelson | Asks if the public utilities hedge the contracts on futures market.   |
| 110       | Cable        | Public utilities sell power on a fixed price basis, and buy from the market at a guaranteed price.  |
| 121       | Chair Nelson | Asks if the public utilities are prohibited by law from investing surplus funds.  |
| 130       | Cable        | Says the public utilities are entitled to buy all forms of insurance and to buy and sell power into the market.   |
