		States that federal charter school grant money will not always be available, therefore it is important to design a bill that meets Oregonis needs.
		Believes that both the public nature and the financial accountability of charter schools are addressed adequately in the bill. States that the committee needs to determine what percentage of charter school costs should be retained by the district.
		States that if there is a procedural appeal to the state board then the state should provide hearings officers.
