255 Rep. Jason Atkinson

House District 51. Presents (**EXHIBIT B**) and testifies in support of HB 2838A which modifies the membership of the Land Conservation and Development Commission (LCDC) to require at least one member from each of seven designated areas. Presents (**EXHIBIT C**) and outlines the provisions of the ñA 4 amendments.

299 Don Schellenberg

Oregon Farm Bureau. Presents (**EXHIBIT D**) and testifies in support of HB 2838A. Notes that the bill provides for a coastal representative on the LCDC and addresses other geographical similarities within the state.

331 Randy Tucker Policy Advocate, 1,000 Friends of Oregon. Testifies in support of the ñA4 amendments and HB 2838A. Agrees that appointments based on congressional districts do not adequately represent regional differences in Oregon.

386 Schellenberg Summarizes the proposed regional appointments and the provisions of Section 2 of the ñA4 amendments. Recommends a conceptual amendment that would exchange subparagraphs (b) and (d).

402 Rep. Atkinson Adds that the conceptual amendment would allow the appointments to be made in the order that vacancies occur.

006 Tucker Comments that he does not object to the proposed conceptual amendment.

018 Sen. Beyer Asks why the number of appointments was established at seven.

021 Rep. Atkinson Answers that seven members was the consensus.

**HB 3259A PUBLIC HEARING**

238 Rep. Bruce Starr House District 3. Testifies in support of HB 3259A which allows county comprehensive plans to establish or extend urban services from inside urban growth boundary (UGB) to area inside the county but outside the growth boundary if certain conditions are met.

286 Sen. Beyer Asks if there is available land within the UGB.

294 Rep. Starr Responds that there is no available land within the UGB and any land that would be available would be too expensive.

298 Pat Egan Associate, Conkling, Fiskum & McCormick. Presents **(EXHIBIT E)** and testifies in support of HB 3259A. Relates efforts by the City of Beaverton to find suitable property for school development.

340 Rep. Starr Notes that the land use policy has resulted in higher prices for developable property.

350 Sen. Miller Agrees that land use planning drives up the prices of land and reduces the quality of life. Asks why this policy would apply only to schools and not for families.

361 Rep. Starr Responds that the bill is only focusing on public schools.

371 Rep. Ryan Deckert House District 8. Testifies in support of HB 3259A. Notes that the infill in Beaverton has allowed the building of schools near to the communities they serve.

392 Sen. Beyer Asks where the children will live who attend the schools outside the UGB in the urban reserve areas.

402 Rep. Starr Answers that the urban reserves are located contiguous to developed residential property.

410 Sen. Beyer Comments that may be true in Hillsboro and Beaverton but not in other urban areas within the state. Asks if there have been discussions on expanding the UGB.

| 079 | Rep. Starr    | Explains that the expansion of the UGB in the Hillsboro area is going through the appeals process.   |
| 097 | Sen. Courtney | Discusses the appeals process with Rep. Starr and emphasizes that the land use laws are operating exactly as intended in Washington County.  |
| 112 | Rep. Deckert  | Emphasizes that the intent is not to overthrow the land use process but to allow a reasonable accommodation.   |
| 128 | Egan          | Reviews growth projections in Washington County. Reiterates the difficulties of locating suitable sites for schools in Washington County.  |

Presents (**EXHIBIT F**) and testifies in support of HB 3259A. Explains the different cost of property in Washington County inside and outside the UGB.

- 253 Chandler Notes that adjustments need to be made in the land use policy to accommodate regions of high growth. Adds that the net effect on land use policy will be minor.
- 276 Mary McCurdy Staff Attorney, 1,000 Friends of Oregon. Presents (**EXHIBIT G**) and testifies in opposition to HB 3259A. Notes that the urban reserve is the area where the UGB might expand once the 20-year land supply within the UGB is used up.
- 322 McCurdy Reviews the urban reserve and the exception areas within Washington County where schools could be constructed.
- 349 Chair Starr Points out that two of Hillsboro's three high schools are within one mile of the proposed amended UGB.
- 362 McCurdy Recommends that the UGB be modified in order to site schools. Adds that inadequate school funding is not justification for compromising Oregon's land use laws.
- 398 Bob Rindy Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD). Presents (**EXHIBIT H**) and testifies in opposition to HB 3259A.

- 002 Rindy Explains that urban reserves are intended for long term inclusion in the UGB. Notes that the issue is not unavailable developable land, but available land at a price that developers want to pay. Adds that most school districts do not factor busing costs into the siting of schools.
- 027 Sen. Bryant Comments that the Bend School District does use busing costs when making siting decisions. Discusses state reimbursement to local school districts for busing costs.
- 053 Rindy States that Metro has a minor UGB amendment process that would be a better solution.
- 061 Sen. Beyer Asks for a time line for the processing of UGB adjustments within the state and the timeline for the minor amendment process.
- 066 Rindy Answers that he is not aware of the timelines for those processes.
- 068 McCurdy Adds that the minor amendment process within the Metro area takes a matter of months. Discusses the appeals process with the committee.
- 083 Sen. Beyer Asks if they are aware of the amount of developable property in the Beaverton and Hillsboro area.
