Reviewed HB 3163 - A29 (EXHIBIT A).

First change is top of Page 2: Transponders, electronic filing

015 Dick Yates Line 5 "For any period in which the carrier reports and pays electronically"

Line 11: Report occur twice, 70th and 71st legislative assemblies

Page 15, Section 29a: Rewritten and generalized requirements that must be met.

042 Grace Crunican Testified concerning "Freight Study" date language.

071 Yates Continued review of HB 3163 -A29: Page 17 lines 21-23: Require Dept. of Revenue to reimburse providers of telephone subscriber tax for the cost of implementing tax.

075 Rep. Edwards	Concerning Page 17, line 14: Asked, who is liable for nonpayment collection of tax?
080 Chair Brian	Intent is not that telephone companies would be responsible to collect for non-payers. Same language as 911.
094 Rep. Lewis	Asked, if a payer doesn't pay the entire bill, who takes a cut?
103 Gary Bauer	In case of partial payment, PUC requires local exchange service first. If amount owing, it is rolled over, so tax would continue to grow on the bill.
130 David Yandell	Over last 15 years, number citizens have refused to pay 911 tax. That amount grows against their bill but remains uncollected. Telecommunications companies are not required to pay the tax, the liability is on the subscriber.
150 Rep. Lewis	Referred to HB 3163 -A29 Section 33: Concerning per line charge.

155 Chair Brian Section 33 is still a per line charge, looking to limit charge to two lines. Bill currently

charges businesses for every line.

Moved out of suspension of rules.

290 Rep. Lewis	Will oppose adoption of HB 3163 -A29 amendments, objected to creating a new tax that can be raised in future.
306 Chair Brian	NOTING REP. LEWIS' OBJECTION TO MOVING 3163 -A29 AMENDMENTS INTO HB 3163A, ADOPTED -A29 AMENDMENTS INTO HB 3163A.
322 Chair Brian	Noted UP 2162 A 28 amondments proposed by Pop I awis regarding driver
342 Ed Marges	Explained, intent is to transfer responsibility for rules and regulations of driver education program from Department of Education (DOE) to Department of Transportation (ODOT).
	HB 3159 dealt with rules and regulations of program, it failed get out of committee. These amendments are being offered instead.
382 Crunican	One problem with current driver education curriculum is, no safety tie. Tying curriculum to safety requirement will improve drivers education program and lower accident rates in young people.
407 Marges	ODOT does bicycle safety training, safety seat, motorcycle safety training, alcohol DUI program.

422 Greg McMurdo As superintendent of public instruction, expressed support for amendment as written. Under this amendment, there would be no transfer of funds or transfer of position authority. This is an incomplete transfer. Would not oppose ODOT taking over driver training, would like to see amendments for a complete takeover.

Committee has two options, to not move it, but develop it then send it to Senate

460 Chair Brian Revenue Committee; or adopt amendments and send it to Senate Revenue Committee. Asked committee's preference.

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039	Rep. Lewis	Would prefer to adopt HB 3163 -A28 amendments and address other concerns on Senate side.
048	Crunican	Clarified, if bill remains as is, ODOT will do curriculum development. Makes no sense to split program between development, implementation.
067	McMurdo	Noted, amendments would not affect driver education instructors.
072	Rep. Lewis	MOTION TO MOVE HB 3163 - A28 AMENDMENTS INTO HB 3163A.
078	Brian	ASKED FOR ANY OBJECTIONS TO MOVING HB 3163 -A28 AMENDMENTS INTO HB 3163A. NOTING OBJECTION BY REP. SIMMONS, CHAIR SO ORDERED.
	Deyei	MOVED HB 3163A TO THE FLOOR WITH A DO PASS AS AMENDED RECOMMENDATION.
	Rep. Edwards	Will support bill, although troubled by telephone access fee. Encouraged 1999 legislature to consider whether this fee is working, looking, or at least put in sunset.
099	Vice Chair Beyer	Submitted telephones and calls for dollar ride have closer nexus (connection) than cigarette taxes.
107	Rep. Lewis	Will not support HB 3163A due to access fee. Committee should have committed more cigarette tax to senior and disabled, and directed more of this money to rural areas. Dividing money up on per capita basis is wrong way to go.
		Likes design build concept in package. Would have liked to see more modernization money for road projects. Package is too large, legislature risks entire package at ballot box. Should have come up with smaller package that voters would like.
145		Will support HB 3163A, although he agrees with much of what Rep. Lewis just mentioned. Package is too large, but past legislatures have failed to deal with road situation. Failing this bill would put off the inevitable and make repairs more expensive.
	Rep. Shetterly	Troubled by transportation fee, although recognizes cigarettes have no better nexus. Transportation access fee will benefit his district. Understands telecommunications objections, but has not heard a better idea.
		Recognizes this bill is an evolving package that will change and may ultimately be resolved in conference committee. Concerned with public perception that ODOT is "a black hole for dollars." Challenged ODOT to show "concrete results." People don't like to pay taxes when they don't get anything for it.
		Perfect opportunity to use legislative oversight to follow the money.
		This is a difficult day for him. There is something in this bill for everyone to hate.

Weight mile increase is punitive. Uncomfortable with access fee. On the other hand, the analogy that "there is no road fairy" who will solve the problem is true. His district is rural, and many seniors and disabled need transportation. He is uncomfortable with amount of need stated. Needs a safety net for rural Eastern Oregon counties that no longer have timber receipt dollars for their road budgets. With great reservation, will support HB 3163A.

Believes committee held true to request of drafters not to tamper with bill too much. Need to move bill forward.

Disagreed with Rep. Lewis' claim that because Lane County has LTD, the rural people are taken care of. Neither Cottage Grove nor Oakridge has bus service.

249 Rep. Corcoran Has seen ODOT in different light over past 10 years. Represented classified employees for ODOT. Watched what ODOT has done internally in terms of accountability. Sees positive change since Ms. Crunican arrived. Cautioned, private sector, not ODOT, is the "big black hole" in terms of where the money is going, due to inefficiencies. Supports HB 3163A because of access fee, not despite of it. Concerning Ms. Crunican's comment about not building more roads, it is not possible to build your way out of congestion.

> Expressed frustration that legislature has failed to deal with transportation since 1989. That is part of reason why package is this size. Also, haven't dealt with population growth, inflation, or problems within ODOT. It's always easy to criticize a bureaucracy, but, in truth, transportation is the most privatized service in the state.

300 Vice Chair 3/4 of money goes out in private contracts. Private contractors are to blame for inefficiencies.

Costs to pave a freeways are going up. Private wages are higher.

No one wants to vote for a package this size, but he understands the condition of the roads. This package isn't the best, but it is what is available. Will support HB 3163A.

374 Rep. Not satisfied with truck weight mile tax.

Glad this day has arrived. Oregon has a growing state and an aging transportation system, mostly built since 1950s. If state continues to ignore system, it will get more costly. Package is comprehensive.

394 Chair Brian What state does with money is tangible. Roads cost money.

Access fee is troublesome for everyone, even those who support it. Wonders, is there a better way? This question gets into flexible funds issue. Legislature has to develop new ways to reduce single occupancy vehicle use.

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Oregon has over 70 mass transit systems, most small. Some are a van with a volunteer

driver. This bill will help that.

Appreciates work by ODOT and by Ways and Means to increase accountability.

033 Chair Brian Biggest disappointment with bill is trucking portion. Hopes legislature will continue to examine and streamline weight mile tax.

If package becomes law, total government burden will be 40 cents a mile compared to twice that in surrounding states. Oregonians are still getting a good value. Will vote yes.

Thanked committee and Dick Yates for their work on transportation package. 7 - 1 - 1
