003 Sen. Stull Opens the meeting at 4:55 p.m.

008 Dale Penn Representative, Oregon District Attorney's Association.

States that the intent of the bill is commendable. Discusses

problems

with the bill and suggests replacement language. Asks committee

to

remove Section 4 from SB 35.

035 Rep. Minnis Asks if the District Attomey's were represented when the bill had hearings.

037 Penn Does not know if District Attorneys were present for discussion.

Explains that amendments were not available for inspection.

045 Rep. Minnis Asks how the bill has problems, if the language remains in place.

049 Penn Explains that the language is related to the joinder statute not the venue

statute. Describes reasons to remove the language.

055 Rep. Minnis Indicates that the bill is specific to child physical or sexual abuse.

058 Penn Explains who and what crimes the language would be related to.

070 Rep. Minnis Verifies that under other provisions of the law, multiple trials can be joined.

073 Penn Assuming that the language is gone.

074 Rep. Minnis Asks if trials can be joined if they are for the same suspect, same victim,

and same crime.

079 Penn Indicates that the defendant would have to give consent for the trial.

081 Rep. Minnis Asks how that is different than what the bill proposes.

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083 Penn Suggests that if the defendant agrees to a single trial in one county, other trials can be joined if the defendant gives a waiver for the trial. Explains how the proposed legislation would change that.

095 Rep. Minnis Asks if the legislation applies to multiple victims of the same suspect in the same jurisdiction. Indicates that the victims would be allowed individual trials.

099 Penn Indicates that the same or similar character crimes can be joined.

102 Rep. Minnis Asks what happens in multiple jurisdictions.

103 Penn Indicates that multiple jurisdictions would be not)fied that their suspect

can be prosecuted in other jurisdictions and they would be asked to

waive their trials to resolve the issue in one jurisdiction. Explains that

that

the bill might allow the suspect to refuse the waiver option.

126 Rep. Minnis Agrees that the argument can be made. Expresses support for the conceptual amendments.

133 Nikkola Jones Indicates that the -B9 amendments will remove Section 4 of SB 35.

137 Rep. Minnis MOTION' Moves to ADOPT SB **35-B9 amendments dated 6127197.**

140 Chair Stull Hearing no objections, declares the motion CARRIED.

154 Rep. Minnis MOTION: Moves SB 35 to the floor with the recommendation that

the House and Senate concur in amendments

dated

6/27/97 and repass the Measure.

156 Chair Stull Hearing no objections, declares the motion CARRIED.

REP. MINNIS will lead discussion on the House floor.

SEN. STULL will lead discussion on the Senate floor.
