### **OPENED PUBLIC HEARING ON HB 3411**

Said this is the companion bill to SB 346 which submitted the \$150 million bond question to the voters. HB 3411 is the implementation language for that bill should the voters approve the bond measure. It would be funding K-12 education projects. It states its intent to pay debt service on the bonds after 1997-99 from Education Endowment earnings. Makes amendment to HB 3695 which would transfer 75% of Education Endowment Fund earnings from State Scholarship Commission to pay off bonds 7/30/99. Bond proceeds would be deposited in School Capital Construction, Maintenance, and Technology Fund and be distributed to school districts in 1998-99 using districts' proportion students to statewide total weighted students. Lottery process

and funds to serve as backup to pay off bond if earnings not sufficient. Also talks about which bonds get first access to Lottery funds. Questions and discussion.

### **OPENED PUBLIC HEARING ON HB 2049**

065Brian<br/>ReederSaid this bill extends sunset date by two years on current assessor funding program and it<br/>is funded through two mechanisms. Increases revenue to the fund by approximately \$3<br/>million over current levels, which are currently about \$12 million now, so would generate<br/>about \$15 million next year and the following year.

089 Reeder	Exhibit G - (-A12) Amendments have to do with the additional four percentage points of interest on delinquent property taxes that would go into the assessor funding account. The bill as it is now would subtract from that additional revenue the distributions that currently go to counties and school districts from the unsegregated tax account. Starting in 7/1/99 the Amendment would shift funds from school district revenue to assessor funding account or approximately an additional \$3 million per year. Questions and discussion interspersed.
125 Bob Cantine	Said he supports the (-A12) Amendments. The funds are distributed from the unsegregated tax account according to their budgets because the amount distributed would be based on their estimate of delinquent taxes and uncollected taxes in prior years. Said that the total cost of assessment taxation for the counties is about \$60 million a year.
152 Ozzie Rose	Said he is opposed to HB 2049. This bill would begin in 1999, and the County School Fund contribution will be eliminated in 1999. Will be short \$150 million of bonds going into the 1999 session and asked for a delay on this issue until 1999.
163 Cantine	Added this bill evolved from the original bill which would have increased and expanded the assessors' recording fees as a way to try to help with the funding of this program. Unable to get support to make that happen. If this is not good policy, maybe the whole concept should be abandoned. Added that there is a moratorium on local real estate transfer taxes during the term of this bill, which is a three-year period. There is one year left on the current program and two years it would be extended.
202 Sen. Bryant	Asked if this Committee adopted this Amendment, would the House concur?
206 Cantine	Responded that he did not know what the House intended to do on this bill. Questions and discussion.
