SB 97 PUBLIC HEARING

385 GREG McMURDO, DEPUTY SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION: Explains the
history of SB 97 and the impacts of the bill.

-Problems with student records and directory information requiring parental
consent.

-Problems with yearbooks and releasing information to the newspaper.

-Suggesting recommended amendments.

TAPE 34, SIDE A

035 LUKE: Chair noted that the required 24 hour notice was not given on
these amendments, but he will allow comment on the amendments.

075 -Announces that additional amendments can be ready the end of next week
for consideration.

085 -Comments that this bill has an emergency clause on it to help school
districts in the process of printing annual yearbook.

095 McMURDO: Explains how the bill would be interpreted if the proposed
amendment that changes the language to 10 working days would be adopted.

105 JIM GREEN, OREGON SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION: Explains how school
districts cannot withhold information on students that hinders the
placement of the student into a new district. Districts are currently
having a problem with the language that was previously adopted and this
amendment will clarify.

156 THELMA WELLS, CONFEDERATION OF OREGON SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS: Comments on
the transferring of records.

194 FISHER: The 10 working days is to open, should be more defined, is it
10 working days as
in the business world, or 10 working days for school office, or ten school
days.

250 WELLS: Wants the committee to know that the COSA supports this bill.

250 GAIL RYDER, DIRECTOR OF GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS, OREGON NEWSPAPERS: Submits
and reviews testimony in support of SB 97. (EXHIBIT H) Concerned how
different school districts are interpreting the new requirements passed in
1993.
300 -Explains problems that newspapers have encountered in trying to cover
sports for local school.

SB 97 WORKSESSION

McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary, proposed LC amendments 97-2, fiscal
impact and revenue analysis. (EXHIBIT G)

340 WYLIE: Speaking on the amendment, and supports including it.

355 LEHMAN: Agrees, would like to keep it simple.

370 MILNE: Doesn't think we need to add the amendment. Districts can
interpret working days and not have their hands tied.

400 MEEK: Moves SB 97 to the floor with a DO PASS.

440 LUKE: Explains the process the bill will go through if it is voted out
today.
