HB 2679 WORK SESSION

010 MANN: Presents an overview of the bill. Recommended by the Human Resources Subcommittee.

045 MOTION: REP. STARR: Moves HB 2679 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote, all members are present and vote AYE.

CHAIR LUKE: The motion CARRIES. REP. STARR will carry to the floor.

HB 3166 WORK SESSION

McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT A)

065 MILNE: Presents information on the bill.

100 MOTION: REP. MILNE: Moves HB 3166 to Committee on Ways and Means with
no recommendation.

154 WYLIE: Does not favor the language in this bill. Not sending the right
message on funding for education.

220 VOTE: In a roll call vote REP. LEHMAN, MEEK, MILNE, SNODGRASS,
STARR, THOMPSON, SHIELDS, LUKE vote AYE. REP. FISHER, ROSS, WYLIE vote
NAY.

300 LUKE: Compliments legislative counsel and staff for the work they have done on these drafts.

360 MOTION: REP. MILNE: Moves to replace HB 2991 as previously amended
with the LC-12 amendments.

440 MILNE: Explains the reason why she is proposing replacing HB 2991 with
the amendments.

Comments on testing and assessment, core academic subjects, training
programs and not mandating programs from the State Board of Education.

TAPE 64, SIDE B

050 MEEK: Comments on recognizing the vision of the original HB 3565, that
sought a change of how we looked at education.

100 FISHER: Comments on the basic of education becoming sidetracked.

150 SNODGRASS: Compliments Rep. Milne on her work done on this issue.

186 LUKE: Comments that no matter what passes today, reminds committee to
remind future legislative sessions to review these issues and continue to
review these issues.

200 MILNE: Closing remarks on the motion.

VOTE: In a roll call vote REP. SNODGRASS, STARR, MILNE, FISHER vote AYE.
REP LEHMAN, ROSS, THOMPSON, WYLIE, SHIELDS, MEEK, LUKE vote NAY.

CHAIR LUKE: The motion FAILS.

250 MOTION: REP. ROSS: Moves to replace HB 2991 as previously amended with
the LC-10 amendments.

260 ROSS: Explains the amendments to the committee. Comments on rigorous
academic standards and the improvement in education.

300 MILNE: Asked why the CIM and CAM language was retained in the LC-10
amendments.

315 ROSS: Explains that it is important to retain the concept of the CIM
and CAM in the language.

329 LEHMAN: Comments on the amendments and the significant complaints that
the committee heard during the public hearings.

355 SHIELDS: Comments on keeping the CIM and CAM language, and the business
community taking hold of the CIM and CAM and their support of the education
community.

393 STARR: Appreciates the effort, but the language fails to accomplish
many of the goals he desired in stopping the centralizing control of
education. Merely the latest fad, and cannot support continuing the
approach taken in this amendment.

450 ROSS: Closing remarks on the amendments.

SHIELDS vote AYE. REP. MILNE, MEEK, SNODGRASS, STARR, FISHER, LUKE vote
NAY.

CHAIR LUKE: The motion FAILS.

050 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves the LC -9 amendments to HB 2991.
VOTE: Hearing no objections, the motion CARRIES.
MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves the LC-11 amendments to HB 2991.
VOTE: Hearing no objections, the motion CARRIES.

100 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves the LC-16 amendments to HB 2991.
VOTE: REP. MILNE objects, the motion CARRIES.

110 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves HB 2991 as amended to the floor with a DO
PASS recommendation.

120 SNODGRASS: Comments on the amendments in LC-16 and the grade levels for
testing. Agrees with the Chair that this issue has to be looked at year to
year.

170 MILNE: Cannot support this bill as amended, this has not gone far
enough. We are still tied to Goals 2000.

200 SHIELDS: Thanks Rep. Snodgrass for her work done on crafting the
compromise amendments.

250 LEHMAN: Will support these amendments, but concerned about the
discipline plans being presented to the Board of Education, also a shifting
of emphasis and putting more demands on local school districts.

270 -Comments on national organizations and national plans and the history
of textbooks coming from California and Texas who purchase the most amount
of textbooks in the county, which drives the purchasing of textbooks nation
wide.

311 LUKE: Closing remarks on the amendments and final bill.

320 VOTE: In a roll call vote REP. MEEK, SNODGRASS, ROSS, LEHMAN, THOMPSON,
WYLIE, SHIELDS, LUKE vote AYE. REP. FISHER, MILNE, STARR vote NAY.
CHAIR LUKE: The motion CARRIES.
