003 CHAIR LUKE: Opens meeting at 8:00 a.m.

SB 99 PUBLIC HEARING

005 McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT A)

010 GREG McMURDO, DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION: Explains the problem with the
current legislation, this bill will correct it.

SB 99 WORK SESSION

030 MOTION: REP. WYLIE: Moves SB 99 to the floor with a DO PASS
recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote all members present vote AYE. REP. MEEK is
excused.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES. REP. WYLIE to carry to the floor.

SB 100 PUBLIC HEARING

McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT B)

060 GREG McMURDO, DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION: Explains the history of the text book commission. This bill repeals the commission.

SB 100 WORK SESSION

115 MOTION: REP. WYLIE: Moves SB 100A to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote, all members present vote AYE. REP. MEEK is excused.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES. REP. SHIELDS to carry to the floor.

SB 105 PUBLIC HEARING

McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT C)

100 GREG McMURDO, DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION: Comments on the bill. Bill clarifies the number of days a child is suspended.

SB 105 WORK SESSION

135 MOTION: REP. ROSS: Moves SB 105A to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote all members present vote AYE. REP. MEEK is excused.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES. REP. THOMPSON to carry to the floor.

SB 148 PUBLIC HEARING

McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT D)

199 GARY VAN HORN, DIVISION OF STATE LANDS: Explains the bill to committee. The bill replaces Oregon State Lands with Oregon State University.

210 -The fund provides loans to agricultural students, which averages \$200 a quarter.

GARY GUSTAFSON, DIRECTOR, DIVISION OF STATE LANDS: Written testimony submitted in support of SB 148. (EXHIBIT E)

240 KEVIN McCAN, OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY: Comments on the bill and the number of students who use this program and are in the agriculture program.

355 SNODGRASS: Questions the fiscal impact report.

375 KATZ: Clarifies question on fiscal impact analysis and the lower interest rate that would occur because of using a much smaller pool of funds.

SB 155 WORK SESSION

McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary and fiscal impact analysis.

390 MOTION: REP. MILNE: Moves SB 155 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote all members vote AYE. REP. MEEK is excused.

CHAIR LUKE: The motion CARRIES. REP. MILNE to carry to the floor.

400 SHIELDS: Asked to suspend the rules and allow REP. MILNE to vote.

405 LUKE: Hearing no objection, the motions carries.

460 McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary, LC-6 and fiscal analysis.

470 DOUG COLLINS, STATE SCHOLARSHIP COMMISSION: Presents statistics to committee on the default rate for the four categories by the type of institution. (EXHIBIT I)

TAPE 85, SIDE A

060 -Reviews fiscal impacts with cost being less if the driver's license portion is removed.

089 KATHY SILKE, COLLECTION AGENT, STATE SCHOLARSHIP COMMISSION: Comments that the commission is currently unable to predict the default rate on collections by occupation.

140 SHIELDS: Concern that the driver's license portion has been deleted. Would like to see it in the bill.

156 LEHMAN: Explains the previous subcommittee discussion on the issue of suspending driver's licenses.

192 THOMPSON: Comments on his concerns about not renewing occupational license.

235 SILKE: The current national default rate is declining.

280 ROSS: The piece of this legislation that is lacking is the initial contact and awarding of the money. Students needs to know the consequences of borrowing for their education.

315 COLLINS: Explains how the collection process occurs, following federal collection guidelines.
The borrower must communicate any hardship to the Scholarship Commission and work with them.

380 LEHMAN: Will it be possible to track the default rate if this legislation passes.

385 COLLINS: Responds yes.

418 SHIELDS: Comments on the problems that students are having in getting a job right out of college.

433 MOTION: REP. SHIELDS: Moves HB 2337 as amended to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.
