430 WYLIE: Dealing with incorrigible young people is very hard, but this
language seems to make the parents responsible for the teenager. In
reality, this might go to far and have unintended consequences.

464 ROSS: Point of clarification on the LC-1 amendments. Supports the
amendment if it does not include the drivers license.

480 LEHMAN: The use of a firearm is a very serious act, and should have
consequences. Not sure suspension of drivers license will deter students
from taking guns or acting violently in or around a school.

060 MILNE: Agreement on the bill in general, but supports the LC-2
amendments because it sends a message about their driving privileges.

090 -In our attempt to keep students in school, we might have been to
lenient in allowing them back into school after being in possession of a
firearm.

100 SHIELDS: Comments that the LC-2 amendments is what the subcommittee
agreed upon.

HB 2089 WORK SESSION

135 MANN: Submits HB 2089 LC-2, LC-3, LC-4 amendments to committee and
explains each. (EXHIBIT E)

172 WYLIE: Comments on the LC-2 amendments and defining the educational
requirements for dental hygienist to work independently.

203 -Previous medical conditions and access to care providers medical
records for review.

227 DELL ISHAM, OREGON DENTAL HYGIENIST ASSOCIATION: Amendments clarify issues brought up during testimony. Association supports the LC-2 amendments.

260 LUKE: Asked about the composition of the Board of Dentistry.

300 FISHER: Concerned about health care providers deciding if a person needs dental care.

325 LUKE: Is there a problem with releasing medical records to dental hygienist.

375 WYLIE: The care provider is providing care, including medication, and wants to use a common sense approach and not have the dental hygienist have to track down doctor's, but rather have access to the records.

430 FISHER: Adult care providers do not procure medical treatment for patients.

050 JANE MYERS, OREGON DENTAL ASSOCIATION: Reviews issues with the committee on the amendments. Supports the LC-4 amendments.

110 ISHAM: Concern about the LC-4 amendments and the scope of practice review committee. Amendments are not helpful in implementing the bill.

130 SHIELDS: Guiding principal is to support those amendments that get the most health care to the most people.

174 WYLIE: Comments on her concerns that the LC-2 amendments creates barriers to providing care for the consumers.

220 MOTION: REP. SHIELDS: Moves to ADOPT HB 2089 LC-2 amendments dated 04/19/95.

293 FISHER: What has been required in the past as far as education.

310 TREASA LEVY, PRESIDENT, OREGON DENTAL HYGIENIST ASSOCIATION: Testifies on the educational background of dental hygienists and the focus of their training.

350 -If conditions exist that need medical treatment, the patient would be referred back to a doctor before dental hygienist would treat.

410 LUKE: Do dental hygienist carry liability insurance.

412 LEVY: Responds yes.
