SB 29-A PUBLIC HEARING & WORK SESSION

005 MANN: Submits and reviews staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT A)

MOTION: REP. STARR: Moves SB 29-A as amended to the floor with a DO PASS
recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote all members present vote AYE. REP. LEHMAN,
WYLIE, SHIELDS are EXCUSED.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES. REP. LEHMAN to carry to the floor.

SB 95-A PUBLIC HEARING & WORK SESSION

050 MANN: Submits and reviews staff measure summary and fiscal impact.

Naturopathic Physicians and submits amendments prepared by Legislative
Action Inc. (EXHIBIT D)

195 -Submitted this amendment to the Senate also.

251 MEEK: Asked about the list of herbs and texts dealing with "Oriental
pharmacopoeia".

320 KATHLEEN HANEY, BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS: Explains Section 14, and
that the Board does not currently screen textbook. There is a process for
review under another Board.

380 MEEK: Questions on Section 5, and the use of the word "may" instead of
"shall".

420 -Changing the shall to may can allow the Board to deny the physician
licensing.

440 MILNE: Questions on Section 3, and inconsistency with subsection (1).

TAPE 100, SIDE A

055 STEPHEN KAFOURY, OREGON ACUPUNCTURE ASSOCIATION: Testifies in support
of SB 238 and the deletion of the "Oriental pharmacopoeia". Submits
amendment for consideration. (EXHIBIT E)

097 ELIZABETH GOLDBLATT, OREGON COLLEGE OF ORIENTAL MEDICINE: Explains the
national certification exam for the (29) naturopathic medicine institutions
in the U.S.

140 MANN: Commented on the textbook issue, some boards review textbooks,
some do not.

150 LUKE: After this bill is amended it will be brought back to this
committee.

SB 384 PUBLIC HEARING

160 MANN: Submits and reviews staff measure summary, explanation of SB 384.

190 KATHRYN WEIT, POLICY ANALYST, OREGON DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES COUNCIL:

Testifies in support of SB 384. Submits and reviews testimony with
committee. (EXHIBIT G)

260 FISHER: Are there any non-profit organizations that currently provide
this services.

270 MILNE: Asked why the other counties are not going to participate and is
there any data showing the success of this program.

325 MEEK: Comments on non-profit services versus for profit services, and
contracting directly for services to provide for families.

354 STARR: Disagrees with the comments from Rep. Meek, and supports non
profit organizations providing services within communities at no cost to
the State.

440 LUKE: SB 384 will be amended and brought back for consideration.

SB 1026 PUBLIC HEARING

MANN: Submits staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT H)

040 SENATOR GREG WALDEN: Introduces and explains SB 1026 to the committee.

044 LUKE: Asked about conflict with pending federal legislation that might impact this legislation.

050 WALDEN: This will put us in line with about 15 other states.

065 LUKE: Would this allow family members override your wishes.

068 WALDEN: No this will not allow family members to override your wishes.

100 MEEK: Questions about minors and when they get their license, can they sign up to be a donor without parental permission.

130 WYLIE: Comments that there will probably be challenges to the pending federal legislation limiting access to DMV records.

180 MEEK: Questions the storing of body parts.

200 SNODGRASS: Questions the procurement or storage of body parts mentioned in the bill.

216 -Is there anything that would exclude body parts to be used for research.

220 FISHER: Comments that the donation of your body for research is a different process.

259 SNODGRASS: Questions about a fetus in the event of the death of the mother. Question was directed at fetal research.

284 SENATOR WALDEN: Bill was introduced to allow more access and flexibility for anatomical donations.

334 -Comments on his personal experience and the donation process.

384 WYLIE: Comments on donor charges for harvesting and donation cost.

SB 1026 WORK SESSION

420 MOTION: REP. ROSS: Moves SB 1026 to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

440 SHIELDS: Comments on what the bill does, by changing the current process.

TAPE 100, SIDE B

035 SNODGRASS: Would like more time to make sure some of her concerns are addressed.

050 VOTE: In a roll call vote, all members present vote AYE. REP. LEHMAN, MEEK, THOMPSON are excused.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES. REP. STARR to carry to the floor.

SB 32 PUBLIC HEARING

MANN: Submits staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT J)

080 DON WALKER, CHAIRMAN OF THE NATUROPATHIC FORMULARY COUNCIL: Submits and reviews testimony with committee. (EXHIBIT K)

140 DELL ISHAM, OREGON ASSOCIATION OF NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIANS: Testifies in support of SB 32.

KEVIN WILSON, NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN, HILLSB ORO: Submits written testimony in support of SB 32. (EXHIBIT L)

184 SHIELDS: What is the purpose of a formulary.

200 WALKER: Explains process for naturopathic medical training. It is a six year program.

230 LUKE: Asked what the current board is not doing, and why the association would like a new board formed. Why the difference between the two boards.

270 SHIELDS: Asked what the process would be to get the new additional member. What type of recruitment for the board opening.

313 SCOTT GALLANT, OREGON MEDICAL ASSOCIATION: Explains the duty of the current council, and their current obligation. Testifies in opposition of SB 37.

380 -The new language on dosage, and whether or not a drug or substance is appropriate for use by naturopaths.

413 MILNE: Asked how often the current council has met.

420 GALLANT: Explains the current council practices stating that the current council is, under utilized.

TAPE 101, SIDE A

040 -Does not feel that this legislation is necessary.

050 DR. MICHAEL CHEEK, PHYSICIAN, LINCOLN CITY: Testifies in opposition to SB 32 and comments that it might allow naturopathic physicians access to pharmacological drugs they do not have access to currently.

095 -Very big difference between conventional medicine and naturopathic medicine.

128 ROSS: If the previous board has not met in a considerable time, then should the board be abolished rather than reconfigured.

140 GALLANT: Does not favor disbanding the current council.

160 LUKE: Asked about the board meetings, and if they have not meet since 1990.

167 WALKER: Explains why the board has not had to meet. They did establish the list of drugs and have not had to meet to review additional drugs recently.

190 WYLIE: Asked about medicines prescribes by nathropathic physicians.

SB 32 WORK SESSION

235 MOTION: REP. WYLIE: Moves SB 32-A as amended to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

280 MILNE: Does not understand the necessity for the bill as it is presented.

294 FISHER: If they have not met since 1990/91, there does not seem to be a problem with the current structure.

VOTE: In a roll call vote REP. STARR, THOMPSON, WYLIE, SHIELDS vote AYE. REP. FISHER, MILNE, ROSS, SNODGRASS, LUKE vote NAY. REP. MEEK, LEHMAN are EXCUSED.

CHAIR: The motion FAILS.
