005 CHAIR LUKE: Calls meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

SB 53 WORK SESSION

015 CHUCK BENNETT, CHIROPRACTIC ASSOCIATION OF OREGON: Discusses SB 53-A6 amendments and supports these amendments. (EXHIBIT A)

020 MIKE LANG, PRESIDENT, OREGON BOARD CHIROPRACTIC EXAMINERS: Comments on the amendments that will delete conflicting and delete reference to proctology.

040 ROSS: Asked if keeping the language will allow all chiropractors to practice in proctology.
 Currently there are very few practicing.

110 MOTION: REP. SHIELDS: Moves SB 53 -A6 amendments dated 5/9/95.

VOTE: Hearing no objections, the motion CARRIES.

MOTION: REP: SHIELDS: Moves SB 53 as amended to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote all members are present and vote AYE.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES. REP. ROSS to carry to the floor.

SB 238 WORK SESSION

150 MANN: Reviews -A6, -A7 and -A8 amendments. (EXHIBIT D)

GARY SCHNABEL, COMPLIANCE DIRECTOR, BOARD OF PHARMACY: Submits testimony in opposition to SB 238. (EXHIBIT B)

174 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves SB 238 A-6 amendments dated 5/5/95.

VOTE: Hearing no objections the motion CARRIES.

MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves SB 238 A-8 amendments dated 5/5/95.

210 FISHER: Does not favor placing some amendments from some other agency into bills.
Is torn on how to vote on this bill.

250 SHIELDS: Comments on voting on the previous bill and adding amendments and now adding amendments to this bill, what's the difference, happens often.

320 FISHER: Not comfortable, this is a controversial issue.

350 SHIELDS: Concerned about the underlying bill and the issue it raises.

365 FISHER: Declares a conflict of interest as a health care provider.

388 ROSS: Comments on the Board of Pharmacy and their written testimony objecting too. (EXHIBIT B)

445 VOTE: In a roll call vote REP. FISHER, MILNE, STARR, MEEK, SNODGRASS,
LUKE vote AYE. REP. ROSS, WYLIE, LEHMAN, THOMPSON, SHIELDS vote NAY.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES.

470 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves SB 238 as amended to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote REP. FISHER, MILNE, STARR, MEEK, SNODGRASS,
LUKE vote AYE. REP. ROSS, WYLIE, LEHMAN, THOMPSON, SHIELDS vote NAY.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES. REP. MEEK to carry to the floor.

REP. SHIELDS, LEHMAN, ROSS: Serve notice of minority report.

TAPE 110, SIDE A

SB 262 PUBLIC HEARING & WORK SESSION

050 McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary and SB 262 amendments -A15, -A17, -A19, -A20.

(EXHIBIT C)

-SB 262 A-19 submitted after review of bill by Attorney General for Department of Education.

-SB 262 A-20 are conflict amendments and should be adopted if the bill is passed.

095 REP. TOM BRIAN: Testifies on the Tualatin District and supports boundary change as presented in the -A15 amendments. Offers statement of support from City of Tualatin and letter from City Manager Steve Rhodes.

(EXHIBIT E)

153 -Originally submitted a bill in 1989 to help resolve this issue.

-Quality of education between the two school districts is not an issue, it is the distance students have to travel out of their area to attend a neighboring school.

190 -Another issue is that students cannot participate in after school sports unless they have alternative transportation, if they do not attend a local school it is much harder.

241 REP. RON ADAMS: Originally introduced as SB 716. Adjustments need to be made in school boundaries.

262 -The Senate decided to not move SB 716, but it was much broader.

270 LUKE: SB 716 and these amendments are very different. These amendments have a narrow scope to resolve a specific issue.

280 ADAMS: Does not like to come to session and try to resolve local issues. Local issues should be resolved on a local level by people who are being reasonable.

306 FISHER: Asked how a boundary change is initiated.

315 BRIAN: Responds by petition and by election process of affected area.

353 LEHMAN: Asked about the historical battle between home builder and local school district that started this.

390 THOMPSON: Has to ask himself, what is the best thing for the children.

405 BRIAN: Local schools are the best, where students can participate and
parents can be active.
448 -Outlined the affected area, which involves two school districts.

060 MEEK: Comments that this issue has been discussed in previous sessions.

065 JOHN YOUNG, LEGISLATIVE CHAIRMAN, LINN-BENTON-LINCOLN EDUCATION SERVICE
DISTRICT: Testifies in support of SB 262, but in opposition to the -A15
amendments. Submits written testimony from Superintendent Gerald Bennett.

with committee. (EXHIBIT G)

198 STEVE HILL, SUPERINTENDENT OF CANBY: Testifies that the -A15 amendments
would not allow the affected area to vote on the issue.

266 DIANA GODWIN, LOBBYISTS: Submits testimony in support of the amendments
to SB 262. (EXHIBIT H)

270 LAURA AUST: Lives in the affected area and testifies on trying to get a
waiver unsuccessfully.
Supports this bill and amendments.

317 DARLENE CAIN: Testifies in opposition to this bill and amendments.
Provides historical background on the issues. Only eight children are
affected by this special legislation.
