010 WILMA WELL, CONFEDERATION OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS The association does not concur with this bill Consolidation of certain districts will cause more problems

030      LUKE It is his understanding that the -A15 amendments will only affect two districts

035      JOHN YOUNG, WASHINGTON ESD: Agrees that the language is not clear and it might affect more than two districts

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050      SEN. HAMBY: Submits and review testimony with committee and submits SB 262 -A21

amendments. (EXHIBIT A)

100      RON CHASTAIN, ECONOMIST: Recently finished a study with Moore Breithaupt & Chastine, Inc. titled "A Cost Efficiency Study of Selected EDS Services" for the Oregon

Association of Educational Service Districts.

150      -Equalization of services or economy of scale services for each district.

180      LEHMAN: Questions if a district can opt out and secure their own

services, therefore leaving the  
other schools in the districts to fend for themselves to secure services.  
220 MEEK: The amendment does not take away the ability to pull away from  
securing services with  
the local EDS or by themselves.  
250 -Brings the control of the funds back to the local school district and  
makes the ESD serve as a  
facilitator in securing services.  
300 SUPERINTENDENT BITNER, DOUGLAS COUNL"Y EDS: Questions if the larger  
school  
pulls out of joint services, the smaller schools might not be able to  
provide those services.  
330 REP. JOHN SCHOON: Test)ifies on the amendment and affects to smaller  
schools in the  
districts.  
380 ROSS: Question on the quantity of services.  
430 SEN. HAMBY: More and more districts are balking about the price or  
services through local  
ESD. The dollar factor per student is \$100 to \$150 dollars.

050 BITNER: Some services cannot be secured except through the ESD. Smaller  
districts will be  
impacted if they cannot combine services with an ESD.  
095 CHRIS CREAN, LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL: Answers the questions from the  
committee  
regarding larger schools in a district offering services to other schools  
in the district.  
120 -Question on whether a school is required to buy services through their  
local ESD.  
130 ROSS: Where is the control on the quantity of services billed back to  
schools from the local  
ESD.  
150 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves to adopt SB 292 -A21 amendments dated 5/12/95.

170 SHIELDS: Would like more time to review this issues. The idea has  
merit, but would like to ask a lot more questions.

VOTE: In a roll call vote REP. MEEK, MILNE, SNODGRASS vote AYE. REP.  
[ISHER, LEHMAN, ROSS, STAR, THOMPSON, WYLIE, SHIELDS, LUKE vote NAY.

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CHAIR: The motion FAILS.

235 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves to adopt SB 292 -A20 amendments dated 5/9/95.

VOTE: Hearing no objections, the motion CARRIES.

245 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves to adopt SB 262 -A19 amendments dated 5/9/95.  
252 GREG MMURDO, DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION: Senate adopted amendments to  
allow ESD boards to choose how many directors they wanted. This adds the  
language.  
280 VOTE: Hearing no objections, the motion CARRIES.  
285 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves to adopt SB 262 -A17 amendments dated 5/9/95.  
295 VOTE: Hearing no objections the motion CARRIES.

335 JOHN DRAGON, CENTRAL ESD: Explains the history of the Central School  
District boundary controversies. Submits and reviews testimony with  
committee. (EXHIBIT C)

366 -The proposed amendments will not just impact the Sherwood and Tigard Districts, but other districts and the language in the amendment contains serious flaws.

420 KRISTIE DARLING, SHERWOOD HIGH SCHOOL: Represents students in the area that do not want to change schools. Drives to school and is active in sports. Wants to graduate from Sherwood High.

470 DARLENE CAIN, SHERWOOD: Urges committee to adopt SB 262, but without the amendments,. Submits, and reviews testimony with committee. (EXHIBIT D)

TAPE 111, SIDE B

045 -Explains the history between the two school districts and their public battle with a developer.

085 -Currently have 24 inter-district agreemen~,  
RUSS JOKI, SUPERINTENDENT, TIGARD-TUALATIN ESD: Urges support of the amendments.

099 MIKE HIATT, PARENT/RESIDENT: Originally moved in and agreed to live in Tualatin and have children go to school in Sherwood; has since changed his mind and would like the children to go to local schools and not be bussed.

140 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves to adopt SB 262 -A15 amendments.

150 SHIELDS: Question on whether this amendment would only effect a few districts

155 JOE BARKOFSKI, LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL: Cannot assure the committee that the amendment would only affect a few districts at this time.

195 MILNE: This is a very difficult situation for everyone.

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212 -Is there a possibility to have a conceptual amendment that will limit this to solving the local problem and not impact other districts.

220 BARKOFSKI: Until you examine all of the school districts in the state, you cannot assure that amendments such as these before you will not impact any other district.

230 LEHMAN: This situation is reprehensible and both school districts need to take care of this problem. There are means to solve this problem, and not have the Legislature try to micro manage this problem. If we craft it narrowly, it will still effect other districts in the state.

251 MEEK: Questions if an amendment could limited this proposal to a certain district such as Washington County. This is his third session and it has been brought up at each of the last three sessions.

268 BARKOFSKI: If the amendment is to limit it, it would be better to name the district, rather than outline the boundary in the language. Does not think it would raise a constitutional problem if it was done that way.

284 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves a conceptual amendment to SB 262 -A15.

300 LUKE: A conceptual amendment will need unanimous consent to move the

bill to the floor.

310 MEEK: Withdraws previous conceptual amendment.

320 FISHER: Comments on amount of time students are on the bus.

350 CAIN: Reports on the computerized time report that students are on the bus.

380 LAURA AUST: Testified previously on how long her children are on the bus.

VOTE: In a roll call vote on SB 262 -A15 amendments REP. FISHER, MEEK, MILNE, ROSS, STARR, SHIELDS, LUKE vote AYE. REP. LEHMAN, SNODGRASS, THOMPSON, WYLIE vote NAY.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES.

430 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves SB 262 as amended to the floor with a DO PASS recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote all members are present and vote AYE.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES. REP. MEEK to carry to the floor.

470 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves to adopt HB 2661 -A7 amendments.

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VOTE: Hearing no objections the motion CARRIES.
