005 CHAIR MILNE: Opens meeting at 8:36 a.m.

HB 2542 WORK SESSION

010 McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary, LC-1 and LC-2 amendments and
reviews. (EXHIBIT A)

060 THOMPSON: Does not favor a blanket prohibition.

070 LEHMAN: Can see both sides, and problems with students leaving campus
to smoke. Are we
micro-managing an issue that school districts should handle.

110 DON SHORE, OREGON EDUCATION ASSOCIATION: Comments that this has been a
bargaining issue in the past, and would like to keep it on a local level.

160 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves to ADOPT the LC-1 amendments to HB 2542.

VOTE: In a roll call vote, REP. LEHMAN, SHIELDS, SNODGRASS,
LUKE, MILNE vote NAY. REP. MEEK votes AYE.

THOMPSON,

CHAIR MILNE: The motion not receiving a majority vote, FAILS.

MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves HB 2542 be sent to full committee with a DO
PASS recommendation.

VOTE: In a roll call vote, all members are present and vote AYE.

CHAIR MILNE: The motion CARRIES. REP. MEEK will carry to the full
committee.

190 HB 2972 PUBLIC HEARING

McCOMB: Submits staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT C)

200 REP. REPINE: Introduces the bill to the committee and provides some background information.

240 DR. HARVEY BENNETT, PRESIDENT, ROGUE COMMUNITY COLLEGE: Submits and reviews testimony with the committee. (EXHIBIT B)
290 -formation of a new community college district and annexation issues.

320 MILNE: Ask what are the concerns in the area.

324 BENNETT: The survey's show the major concern is losing local control.

371 REP. REPINE: Suggest referring the bill to the full committee.

390 LARRY DRAKE, LEGISLATIVE REVENUE: Explains the possible revenue impact and that it would occur in the next biennium budget.

440 REP. REPINE: Comments on the closure issues this will facilitate between two counties, on resolving a long standing problem, and greater community college functions that will be developed.

211 LUKE: Comments that it removes the sunset, allows private colleges to participate and the amount stays at \$50,000.

VOTE: Hearing no objections, the motion is ADOPTED.

235 MOTION: REP. MEEK: Moves HB 2490 as amended with a DO PASS recommendation to the full committee.

VOTE: In a roll call vote, all members are present and vote AYE.

250 CHAIR MILNE: The motion CARRIES. REP. MILNE will carry to the full committee.

BILL BRALY, YOUTH APPRENTICE SPECIALIST, DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION: Comments on the school to work provisions and the interpretations that were being

applied to determine the net benefit or immediate benefit to employers.

374 MEEK: Asked how we get around not paying student teaching.

393 JULIE BRANDIS, ASSOCIATED OREGON INDUSTRIES: Explains the exempt and
non-exempt rules and definitions.

050 LUKE: Does this bill do anything except allow the departments to seek
waivers for work based learning programs.

055 BRANDIS: Clarifies the work based learning programs issue and when or
not a student is paid, outlining four criteria that must be met. Submits
letter from US Dept. of Labor concerning application of the Fair Labor
Standards Act. (EXHIBIT F)
