TAPE , SIDE A 005 CHAIR MILNE: Opens meeting at 11:30 a.m. HB 2892 Work Session 009 DICK MEINHARDT, PORTLAND: Reviews the proposed LC- 4, LC-5, LC-6 amendments to HB 2892, allowing charter schools. (EXHIBIT A) -LC-1, LC-2 and LC-3 amendments have been integrated into the LC-4 020 amendments. -Specific requirements for teachers and the possible religious nature of 055 some charter schools. -Annual report will be used for public disclosure, and is a mandatory 080 requirement. 113 -Board immunity issues, eliminated in the language and debt limited to the term of the charter. 128 -Background checks for teachers and school employees. 132 -Uniformity in records, especially transfer records. 150 SNODGRASS: Comments on the vacant buildings reference of buildings

currently owned by the state.

195 MEINHARDT: LC-5 and LC-6 gives the local board the first right of refusal, with a review by the State Board of Education.

208 LUKE: Concerned that the LC-6 amendments only allow charter approval within 90 days. With this being so short, what if the're in a process of negotiations beyond the 90 days.
237 -If the local school district does not approve, can the charter starters

go to another sponsor. The language leaves it open for "rejection" to include non-action, or action no fast enought to meet the limited timeline.

265 MILNE: The committee discussed the issue of what to do with a district that takes no action on an application.

290 SNODGRASS: Questions on maintaining charter school records in a similar

manner as public student records.
305 THOMPSON: How are local districts going to enforce not having a charter

school that is "religious based".

345 LUKE: Notification to "parent" school district when a charter school goes to or applies to another sponsor in another district.

350 MEINHARDT: Agrees that the local board does need to know about charter schools being considered in their district. Suggest an amendment be done to correct the language.
