005 CHAIR STARR: Opens the meeting at 8:00 a.m.

HB 2338 WORK SESSION

010 MANN: Submits and reviews staff measure summary, LC-5, LC-6 and LC-7. (EXHIBIT A)

028 REP. MEEK: Sponsor of the bill. The LC-5 and LC-6 have been combined.

035 CLARK CAMPBELL, HEALTH DIVISION: Concern with Section 2. In current law, only those involved in a methadone treatment program are given immunity to statutes relating to violation of the control substance statutes.

060 MEEK: Agrees to drop Section 2.

HB 2878 PUBLIC HEARING

080 MANN: Submits staff measure summary. (EXHIBIT B)

090 DENNIS RUSSELL, OREGON ASSOCIATION OF HOMES FOR THE AGING: Testifies in support of HB 2878 and request it be moved to the Committee on Ways and Means for further action.

HB 2878 WORK SESSION

120 MOTION: REP. LUKE: Moves HB 2878 to full committee with a DO PASS recommendation and a subsequent referral to Ways & Means.

VOTE: In a roll call vote, all members are present and vote AYE.

CHAIR: The motion CARRIES. REP. WYLIE to carry to full committee.

160 MANN: Submits and reviews staff measure summary and fiscal impact

175 GROVER SIMMONS, INDEPENDENT ADULT CARE PROVIDERS: Address changes he proposes in the language of the bill.

220 -Reviews the history of the establishing the fine and how the fine was established.

260 SUSAN DIETSCHKE, ASSISTANT ADMINISTRATOR, SENIOR & DISABLED SERVICES DIVISION: Submits and reviews testimony with committee. (EXHIBIT D)

300 ROSS: Ask what the average fine assessed is and what are the circumstances for issuing a fine.

360 FISHER: Asked about a specific case of abuse by a provider and comments.

420 DIETSCHKE: For the record Senior & Disabled Services Division opposes HB 2877.

445 MARJORIE COLE, LANE COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS & OREGON ASSOCIATION OF AREA AGENCIES ON AGING: Submits and reviews testimony in opposition to two sections of HB 2877 and ask that those sections be stricken. (EXHIBIT E)

095 FISHER: Comments on inspections and notes that there is a difference in adult foster care homes versus independent care living centers.

135 WYLIE: Would like it in the legislative record that the intent was discussed, and that un-announced inspections should not proceed against the

detriment of the residents such as previously scheduled activities.
