TAPE 7, A 003 CHAIR BAUM calls the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m. 010 COLLEEN SEALOCK, Office of the Secretary of State clarifies current election law. 031 SEALOCK: The status quo allows for 180 days for the elections process. To allow a 78 day process, his bill calls for the Secretary of State to adopt the outlined administrative rules. 061 SEALOCK: The same process would be followed; the changes are in the time periods alloted for each step. 065 REP. ROBERTS: please clarify the timeline.

078 SEALOCK: the last option is a 54 day process. This does
