020 MARK BAUER, COMMITTEE ADMINISTRATOR: Discusses HB 2615. (See minutes of meeting of 4/24/95 for previous action.)

032 MOTION (by implicit consent): REP. WELLS: Moves HB 2615 to the floor with a DO PASS AS AMENDED recommendation and the SUBSEQUENT REFERRAL to the committee on WAYS & MEANS BE RESCINDED.

General discussion follows.

125 JON CHANDLER, GENERAL COUNSEL, METROPOLITAN PORTLAND HOME BUILDERS ASSOCIATION: Explains the HB 2709-4 amendments (Exhibit I), which are a result of work group efforts among several interested parties. Lists the participants.

175 Continues to explain the HB 2709-4 amendments.

200 CHANDLER: Suggests further amendment; change line 16 of page 7, section 7, propose strike "city and the portion of", and on line 17, "each county"; and insert "the local governments". Period after "boundary", delete balance of line 17 and all of lines 18 and 19.

243 REP. UHERBELAU: Are all groups involved with this in agreement now?

248 CHANDLER: Believes they are.

253 MOTION: REP. NAITO: Moves to amend the HB 2709-4 amendments, on page 7, line 16 and 17, to delete the words "cities and the portion of each county", and insert the words, "the local governments".

259 REP. LEWIS: Believes Mr. Chandler wanted additional things deleted.

- After the word "boundary" , insert a period, and delete the balance of line 17, and all of lines 18 and 19.

REP. NAITO: I accept the friendly amendment to my motion.

265 CHAIR TARNO: Hearing no objections, the conceptual amendments to the HB 2709-4 amendments are ADOPTED.

273 MOTION: REP. LEWIS: Moves the HB 2709-4 amendments, as conceptually amended, BE ADOPTED.

CHAIR TARNO: Hearing no objections, the HB 2709-4 amendments, as conceptually amended, are ADOPTED.

279 LUKE: Moves to suspend the rules to allow the committee to move HB 2709 to the floor. Later withdraws motion.

284 JOHN DILORENZO, J.C. REEVES CORP.: Explains the HB 2709-3 amendments (Exhibit H),. Some property inside city limits of Salem are outside the urban growth boundry.

330 CHAIR TARNO: Asks Mr. Chandler if he has had a chance to see the amendments.

335 CHANDLER: He has.

337 DILORENZO: City of Salem has no objections, also spoke with people at LCDC. 1000 Friends of Oregon had a problem with the amendments, not with substance of amendments, but that they were being added to HB 2709.

359 CHAIR TARNO: Asks Mr. Chandler if he has a problem with adoption of the HB 2709-3 .

365 CHANDLER: Says he has no problem with it, but cannot speak for everyone.

380 REP. NAITO: Finds the process troubling. States that these can be dealt with in the Senate.

396 REP. NORRIS: Asks if he understands correctly that the City of Salem cannot extend city services which are in the city limits but outside of the urban growth boundry.

435 REP. CORCORAN: Asks which cities would be affected by these amendments.

440 DILORENZO: Believes it's only the city of Salem.

455 REP. CORCORAN: States his concerns regarding the last-minute introduction of the -3 amendments, agrees with REP. NAITO.

467 MOTION: REP. FISHER: Moves the HB 2709-3 amendments, BE ADOPTED.

Discussion follows.

CHAIR: The amendments are ADOPTED.

065 MOTION: REP. LEWIS: Moves to SUSPEND the rules for the purpose of moving HB 2709 AS AMENDED BY THE -3 AND -4 conceptually amended amendments with a DO PASS recommendation.

Note: Rule to be suspended is HNR committee rule #13, requiring written LC amendments.

072 REP. NAITO: Asks why LC has only reviewed the HB 2709-3 amendments for form and content. (Exhibit H)

084 MARK BAUER, COMMITTEE ADMINISTRATOR: LC has essentially signed off on the dash three amendments.

094 REP. LUKE: Clarifies that committee rules say you cannot move a conceptually amended bill to the floor without suspension of the rules.

Discussion follows, and it is determined that unanimous consent is required to suspend the rules; there is not unanimous consent among the committee members.

100 REP. NAITO: "I will not object to a suspension of the rules on the -4's if the -3 amendments are deleted from the bill."

107 CHAIR TARNO: Can we have suspension of the rules for the dash four amendments? Notes that the bill cannot be moved to the floor without suspension of the rules.

114 CHAIR TARNO: Announces a recess on this bill in order to get help from legislative council.

123 CHAIR TARNO: Recesses the WORK SESSION on HB 2709.

133 Opens the WORK SESSION on HB 3427.

142 CHUCK BENNETT, KINROSS GOLD U.S.A. & KINROSS COPPER: Introduces Bart Stone.

145 BART STONE, PROJECT MANAGER, KINROSS, MILL CITY, OR: Shows diagrams of how the mine will be constructed and operate. Explains how the water will be handled in a closed loop circuit. Thinks they may be able to do it year round.

195 Continues to show diagrams of the mines workings.

214 States they do not produce sulfate, they produce sulfide. States it's a naturally occurring substance.

228 REP. CORCORAN: Makes reference to the exhibit regarding sulfate and sulfide, EXHIBIT C; Requests followup testimony from DEQ.

250 CAROLYN YOUNG, DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY: Testifies that information recently received from Kinross provides clearer explanation of substances to be transported, and that the substances are not as toxic as they had originally believed.

260 CHAIR TARNO: Questions the toxicity of the substance.

262 TIM MCFETRICH, DEQ: Responds that the substance is not toxic in the form being trucked.

270 REP. THOMPSON: Asks DEQ to explain how they could get this far along and not know what is in these trucks.

274 YOUNG: Explains that they were checking things which fell within the DEQ permit requirements regarding the operation of the site and the discharge from the site. Clarifies that an offsite spill such as from a truck is not within the DEQ's authority in the permit.

290 YOUNG: In response to a question from REP. LUKE, notes that she/DEQ was alerted to their error yesterday, and would be willing to issue a memo if desired.

298 REP. LUKE: If we pass this bill does this still have to go through your hearing and permit process?

306 YOUNG: We view this as a supersiting issue.

342 - Environmental Quality Commission decided to draw the line; decided it was inappropriate policy to exempt one company from the three basin rule. Elaborates.

348 REP. LUKE: So you're saying DEQ set policy instead of the legislature.

356 YOUNG: The DEQ did set state policy for those three basins.

362 REP. UHERBELAU: The Statesman Journal did not get it right. I said if the bill passed out I would continue to research the issue. Feels we are just today getting to the questions that should be answered.

Does the three basin rule prohibit all discharges?

384 YOUNG: Things that are allowed are bridge repair, road construction, etc.

396 REP. UHERBELAU: As storm water comes down doesn't it pick up elements that may be harmful?

405 YOUNG: Yes, one of the reasons to regulate discharge by permit.

413 REP. UHERBELAU: Asks about the conflicting testimony between sulfide and sulfate. Asks for someone to speak on the other minerals that may be leached.

429 STONE: Unique deposit. 60% copper sulfide.

455 Explains the various mineral contents of the rock.

470 REP. UHERBELAU: Asks about possible problems with very heavy rainfall.

TAPE 53, SIDE B

032 STONE: Can't build a dam large enough to hold all of the rain that will fall in 10 years. Want permission to let their impoundment structure overflow in heavy rainfall; states that water quality would be the same as in the creeks.

043 REP. UHERBELAU: Asks for someone from DEQ to address that.

049 McFETRICH: It appears that their discharge would meet all state discharge standards.

067 REP. CORCORAN: When the commission made the decision not to allow for industrial discharge in the three basin area they did so because of inability to monitor.

075 YOUNG: Major concerns about mining "what ifs", rather than day-to-day operations. DEQ does not have the resources to know.

- The three basin area has exceedingly good water there now, but has many mines there already.

096 REP. UHERBELAU: We live our lives in the what if's. Asks if there has been any risk analysis done.

YOUNG: No specific study on this particular mine.

109 STONE: Disagrees; two year risk study done for environmental impact statement. Conclusion was no significant environmental impact.

115 YOUNG: Not aware because it's not a part of permitting process, not familiar with their EIS.

120 REP. LUKE: Asks a series of questions regarding sewage being discharged into the Willamette River, and heavy metal content.

159 REP. UHERBELAU: Asks if they have used their internal process in other mines.

162 STONE: The process is 130 years old. Very tried and proven method.

166 REP. UHERBELAU: Asks if there has been breaks in their mining system.

172 STONE: Not in Kinross mining experience.

226 STONE: Responds to a question from Rep. Thompson regarding the removal of copper at this time and not 10 years from now.

237 REP. LUKE: Explains his previous vote on the matter of the City of Salem's drinking water condition.

258 REP. LEWIS: Requests to see the specifics of the graph brought forth by Mr. Stone.

266 REP. NAITO: Discusses contaminants and the discharge of wastes.

323 STONE: Talks about the provisions made with regard to responsibility for operations.

MOTION: REP. LUKE: Moves to RECONSIDER the vote by which HB 3427 failed to be sent to the Floor.

CHAIR TARNO: Any objections to reconsideration, hearing none so moved.
