as written and amended poses no problems for our office. The deadline for
citizens to file statements for against would be the 24th of March, so
whenever you can get the bill passed and signed by the Governor will
determine the length of time people have to submit arguments for and
against.

093 CHAIR BAUM: How soon does this bill need to be moved?

101 TIGHE: If we receive this bill by March 14th, that would allow
citizens to have a 10 day time period to submit arguments for or against.
